SECTION 1. ISSUES

The above stations have identified the following as some of the more significant community issues addressed by this station for the quarter specified. This listing is by no means complete, nor is the order in which these issues appear intended to imply any degree of priority or significance of the issue.

- A. **COVID-19.** Montana began responding to the COVID-19 pandemic earlier than most states because of the outbreak in nearby Washington State. Counties began to shut down even before a statewide “Stay at Home” order.
- B. **Public Safety.** Living in Montana brings additional public safety issues such as aging wilderness dams. Work is being done to keep them safe.
- C. **Education.** Our education issues this quarter dealt with dyslexia and with how education can be enhanced by documentary films.
- D. **Environment.** Western Montana is home to some large national forests. How to keep the forests healthy and how to fight the annual forest fires were on our agenda.
- E. **Government.** Local government operations and how tax dollars are spent have been increasingly topics of conversation in the community. The public needed to know how government works.
