Sheriff says husband charged with attempted murder after being shot by wife

CAVALIER, ND (WDAZ-TV) - An attempted murder charge has been filed in the case involving a fight between a husband, wife, and another man.

The sheriff says the husband was shot by his wife. That husband now faces multiple charges, including attempted murder.

The sheriff says both the husband and the wife had guns. The two got into a verbal altercation, and the wife fired the shot that hit her husband.

People are working late at the courthouse as the state's attorney is working on the case Thursday night.

Pembina County sheriff Terry Medinger says it started when the husband came home and found his wife with another man inside their home in St. Thomas.

The sheriff says both the husband and the wife had guns. The two got into a verbal altercation, and the wife fired the shot that hit her husband.

Investigators spent all day on scene, and many are still there. The wife says it didn't happen the way investigators think. She says she shot her husband for his own safety, and that he was extremely upset and misinterpreted the entire situation.

She says she was simply consoling a friend, who happened to be male, and she shot her husband to stop him from doing something drastic and dangerous. Sheriff Medinger is still investigating.

"It sounds like the wife had a male friend over at the house, and the husband had come home and shots were exchanged between the husband at the other male friend and the wife had shot at the husband," said Sheriff Medinger.

The sheriff says the husband was sent to the hospital and has since been released. We asked the wife about his condition and she said, "He's fine. It just grazed him."

Cavalier basketball coach charged with beet theft

CAVALIER, N.D.—The head coach of the Cavalier boy's basketball team faces a theft charge after authorities say he took beets from a farmer he was working for without permission to bait deer on his property.

Kyle Bryce Laxdal has been charged with a misdemeanor theft of property. His initial appearance is scheduled for Nov. 8.

Laxdal is the boy's basketball coach at Cavalier High School, where he also works as an instructional strategist, according to the school.

According to an affidavit, Laxdal was driving a load of sugar beets on behalf of truck owner Longtin Farms, who employed him part time during the harvest for the past eight years.

At around 8:30 p.m. Oct. 18, A Cavalier County sheriff's deputy was dispatched to Laxdal's property on reports of tipped over semi-tuck. The affidavit says the deputy spoke with Laxdal, who said he was trying to dump sugar beets to attract deer.

In Cavalier County the unofficial vote total was 2094
In Pembina County the unofficial vote total was 3223

In speaking with Lisa Gellner in Cavalier County the vote totals are similar to the last election when there 2115 ballots cast.

In Pembina county, by late Tuesday morning more than two thousand ballots, mail in or absentee were in hand and 400 people had come into vote

voters in the NE part of the state have elected Janne Myrdal as District 10 Senator with with 63.85% of the votes cast

For District 10 Representatives David Monson with more than 36% cent of votes and Chuck Damschen with over 32% are well in the lead

For judgeships in the northeast part of ND, for district court #1 Lonnie Olson has almost 59% of the vote

For district court #5 Laurie Fontaine ran unopposed

Dave Zeis followed by Richard Ring have the votes needed in the county commissioner race for Cavalier County

In Pembina County Commissioners races, James Benjaminson wins in District 2 with over 67% of the vote and in District 4 the winner is Lavern Doyle with better than 98% of the vote.

The election to fill an unexpired 2 year term for County States Attorney is won by Rebecca Flanders with 57.8% of the vote while Ryan Bialis got just shy of 42%

Voting for some statewide races went strictly Republican

76% of voters chose Doug Burgum for Governor
More than 78% chose John Hoeven to remain in the Seante
Almost 69% voted for Kevin Cramer to retain his seat in the House

In the Presidential race, Donald Trump 62.5% of the vote.

For state ballot measures, the yes votes are leading except for ballot measure 4 which has a 62+% no vote and just over 37% yes

120616 Winter Weather Summary (partial) KM

It does take weather forecasters and observers a bit of time to gather all of the information following a storm, however when it comes to the wintry blast we have seen, it would be a safe bet to say snowfall numbers will be on the large side. Snowfall in parts of Grand Forks County had reached 12 inches or better before daylight on Tuesday, and 8 or more inches of snow had fallen at Karlstad Mn and Pisek ND. Morris MB by mid morning Tuesday had 19 cm, with 12 cm at Brandon and 12 also at Steinbach.

Winds were being reported at well over 30 miles an hour with gusts past 50, including some approaching 60 miles an hour in the Jamestown area. Winds of 60 km/h gusting to 80 km/h have been reported over the western Red River Valley of MB Tuesday morning.

Roads were snow covered in NW MN, large portions of Interstates 29 and 94 were closed in North Dakota, and The North Dakota Highway Patrol has stopped westbound commercial vehicle traffic on Interstate 94.

The interstate is currently closed between Valley City and Dickinson due to poor road conditions.

Highway Patrol says commercial vehicles are asked to stay in Fargo until the interstate re-opens as Valley City does not have the parking or facility capacity to handle the additional vehicles.

In MB, portions of highways 3 and 14 were closed in the Morden/Winkler area and also Highway 13 north to the Transcanda highway, which was reported closed from Winnipeg to as far west as Brandon

Gov.-elect Burgum announces new office structure, names team

BISMARCK—Incoming North Dakota Gov. Doug Burgum's promise to reinvent state government has apparently started with new structure for the governor's staff.

In a news release issued Wednesday, the day before he officially takes office, Burgum announced he will create roles for chief operating officer and chief administrative officer, which will be filled by Jodi Uecker and JoDee Hanson, respectively.

Uecker chaired Burgum's transition team since the Republican won election Nov. 8 and will "work closely with the governor and his appointed agency heads on strategic and cross-cutting initiatives designed to improve processes,

spur innovation and reinvent the delivery of services to realign government for the 21st century," according to the news release.

Hanson will oversee communications, office operations, the policy team, constituent services and boards and commissions. Hanson also served on the transition team.

Ron Rauschenberger, who has served as chief of staff for Govs. John Hoeven and Jack Dalrymple, "will serve as senior adviser to ... Burgum during a transition period," Burgum's team said. Bismarck attorney Leslie Bakken Oliver will be Burgum's general counsel.

Neighborhood Reaction to Christmas Eve Murder

Fargo, N.D. (WDAY/WDAZ-TV) -- A Fargo man 31-year-old Timothy Porter is behind bars after stabbing and killing another man early Saturday.

31-year-old Timothy Porter was arrested on murder charges – leaving the victim's family mourning the loss of a loved one this Christmas Eve.

The stabbing happened inside a blue house located behind the Duane's house of Pizza on University.

The suspect's mother says she's shocked her son would do something like this -- adding her son was close friends with the victim.

Neighbors are feeling that same shock.

"I just work up, and I was on my way to the grocery store, and I noticed there was a bunch of cop cars over by the house," says neighbor Jenna Gisvold.

She's lived in the neighborhood for three years and says she's never seen any kind of trouble.

"It's a pretty safe neighborhood. There's a lot of friendly people around here. Nobody expected anything like this," she adds.

Police we're called to the home around 4:15 this (Saturday) morning where they found a man stabbed in the chest.

The victim was taken to the hospital where he later died.

"On behalf of the men and women of the Fargo Police department, our condolences go out to the families who lost a loved one today," says Dep. Chief Joe Anderson of the Fargo Police Department in a press conference Saturday morning.

Police say he was 26 years old, but they are not releasing his name.

They say there was a dispute between the victim and 31-year-old Timothy Porter.

Porter is now behind bars on murder charges.

A woman who was also in the home during the stabbing was detained for questioning.

Police don't know if drugs or alcohol were involved.

Police say the victim's family is using their rights given by the new Marsy's law.

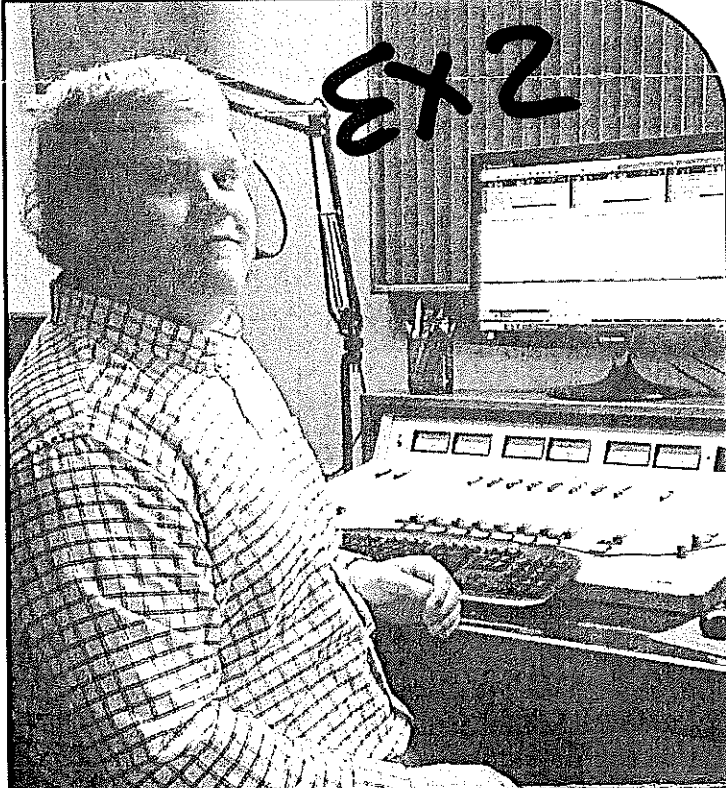

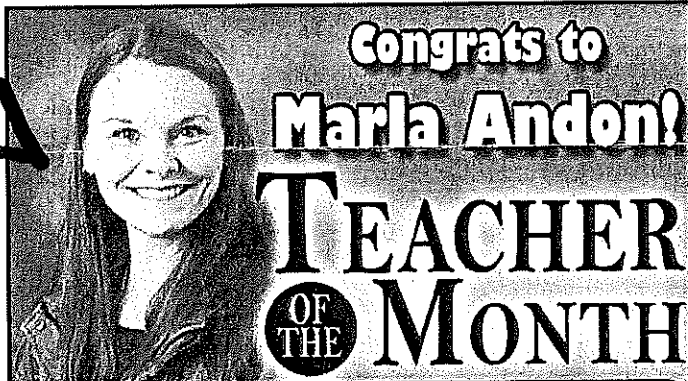

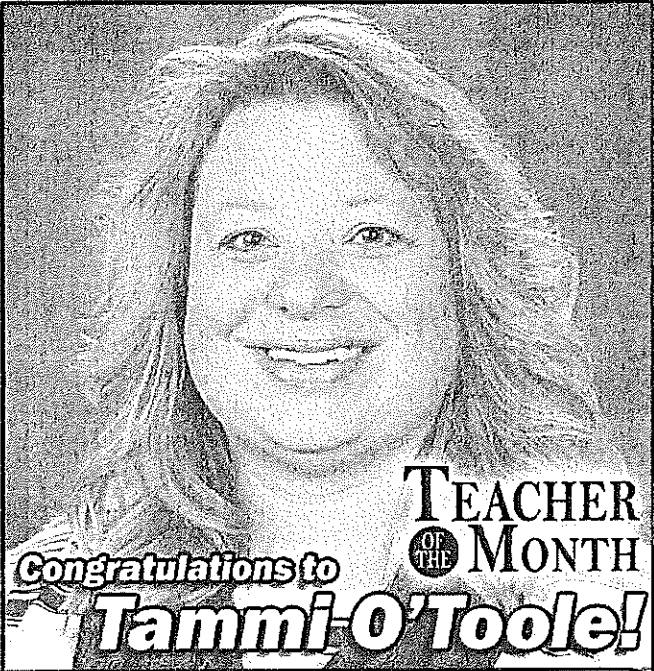
