

## QUARTERLY ISSUES & PROGRAMS LIST

There follows a listing of some of the most significant issues responded to by station WEDG-FM, Buffalo, New York, along with the most significant programming treatment of those issues for the period October 1, 2018 through December 31, 2018. The listing is by no means exhaustive. The order in which the issues appear does not reflect any priority. The issues were covered on WEDG-FM's public affairs program on the dates indicated. The program is 30 minutes long and begins at 8:00 AM on Sundays.

**ISSUE: United Way BVS – Part 1 & Part 2**

**DATE: October 7, 2018**

**DURATION: 28:00 (2 14-minute segments)**

**DESCRIPTION:**

Discussed an overview of Baker Victory Services, funded by the United Way of Buffalo and Erie County.

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**ISSUE: Buffalo Library**

**DATE: October 14, 2018**

**DURATION: 14:00**

**DESCRIPTION:**

Discussed all the things you can do at the Library including downloading music, watching movies, taking classes and different series that are offered. It is not your "grandmother's library" any more. The library also has computers available and computer classes. There are also librarians on hand to help you if you are not knowledgeable on computers. Mary Jean pointed out there are many things the library offers online and you don't even have to come into the building. Library cards are free. Also, there is a book mobile for rural areas.

**DESCRIPTION:**

Discussed what this organization does, how they are funded, what it takes to become a foster parent, what resources are available to assist those considering, what the community should know and how to find out more information.

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**ISSUE: Breast Cancer**

**DATE: October 21, 2018**

**DURATION: 14:00**

**DESCRIPTION:**

Discussed the risk factors of breast cancer. Doctor mentioned self exams and that mammograms are important to catch breast cancer early. The survival rate if caught early is in the patients favor. There are 3D mammograms available for women who need it. There is a risk of men being diagnosed with breast cancer too and the doctor mentions the ways they can get checked. A healthy lifestyle goes a long way to avoid cancers like not smoking or taking part is risky behavior. Why 40? Why Every Year? What are "over-diagnosis" and "false positive" exams and should they affect when I get tested.

**ISSUE: Gateway Longview**

**DESCRIPTION:**

Gateway Longview hopes to enrich the lives of children and they try to place children into homes for adoption. More than 125 years ago, a local church community responded to the needs of children and families in our region. Upon founding an orphanage known as the Deaconess Home of the Methodist Episcopal Church, a tradition of ministry was begun. This organization was later joined by a similar agency, also founded by caring Christians and known as the Protestant Home of Unprotected Children. Today, Gateway Longview continues our rich heritage of holistically caring for the needs of young people and their families by providing a spectrum of highly specialized care and treatment programs. They offer orientation for parents looking to adopt children. They also have services for children who do not get adopted.

Evergreen Health is formerly AIDS Community Services. They still help HIV and AIDS patients, and now offer other health care to the Buffalo and WNY community. They allow anyone to receive treatment at Evergreen. They will help patients to handle the mental aspect of AIDS related difficulties. They have several locations and some have a pharmacy on hand. They offer Hepatitis C treatment, hearing and vision screening, physical exams and immunizations, gynecological care, EKG and substance abuse screening and treatment.

She says she is not against drinking, but it is important to make arrangements and THINK before drinking and then driving. She made it her mission to tell Karen's story and teach, especially young people, the reality of DWI.
