Discussed the history and mission of the agency, the role of the juvenile division, back to school safety on NFTA buses and metro rail, the structure of collaboration between other agencies and divisions within the police department, how the candidates are recruited for employment, the upcoming exams and employment opportunities and how the community can help and get more information.

ISSUE: Black Dog Second Chance Rescue

Discussed what Literacy Volunteers does, how many people are on the waiting list, 1 in 5 residents of Erie County are functionally illiterate. Volunteers are used to teach English to those who need it. The volunteers have to agree to do it for

1 year, so their students can have the same teacher. There is a training program for the volunteers. There are peer to peer services, one to one for adults and neighborhood services. This is the 50th anniversary of the organization and a fundraiser will take place on the 29th. Also discussed that the trickle down effect of illiteracy is noticeable. Those who cannot read or write cannot get good paying jobs.
