OUARTERLY ISSUES & PROGRAMS LIST

There follows a listing of some of the most significant issues responded to by station WEDG-FM, Buffalo, New York, along with the most significant programming treatment of those issues for the period April 1, 2015 through June 30, 2015. The listing is by no means exhaustive. The order in which the issues appear does not reflect any priority. The issues were covered on WEDG-FM's public affairs program on the dates indicated. The program is 30 minutes long and begins at 6:00 AM on Sundays.

ISSUE: 2015 Community Baby Shower

DATE: April 5, 2015

DURATION: 28:00 – (2) 14-minute segments

DESCRIPTION:

Discussed the 2015 Community Baby Shower, which engages the community in collecting new baby items such as diapers, onesies, sleep sacks and digital thermometers. These items are distributed through three community agencies to new mothers experiencing financial difficulties.

DESCRIPTION:

Guests discussed the services Catholic Charities provides, how they are funded and details of the 2015 appeal, how the community can get more information, how the older adult programs help the WNY community, additional programs Catholic Charities offers to people of all faiths and the theme this year, "Find the Good Within".

Discussed getting help to stop Domestic Abuse, how Suzanne can reach out to

you and how this FREE event will help those that are being abused.

ISSUE: Camp Hope DATE: April 19, 2015 DURATION: 14:00

DESCRIPTION:

Discussed what Camp Hope is and who it serves, ages for kids and whit is "grief camp", who is eligible to participate and receive services, what services hospice provides and what the new collaborations are, how they are funded, how the community can get more information, hope to help with volunteerism and upcoming events, how to get more information for family members and patients interested.

Also discussed their 3 locations, they are a "one stop shop" where women can get legal help, help for their kids and safety planning.

DESCRIPTION:

Discussed the history of this rescue, what black dogs are disadvantaged, who is eligible to participate and receive foster animals, how they are funded, how the community can get more information and how to help with volunteerism and upcoming events.

DESCRIPTION:

Discussed the mission of ESD and how it has helped WNY, how they are funded, how the community can get more information and upcoming regional plans and projects already completed.

ISSUE: Substance Abuse in our Community

DESCRIPTION:

Discussed the history and mission of Brylin (an additional option for services), the structure of collaboration between other agencies, how prevalent substance abuse is in our community and how the community can help, how to get more information, what can be done once abuse is identified, what treatment looks like and how the local mental health services are funded.

ISSUE: Chiari Walk DATE: May 24, 2015 DURATION: 14:00

DESCRIPTION:

Discussed that the annual walk is on September 19th this year. The walk will be to raise awareness and funds for Chiari. The disease is a neurological disorder in the brain. There are symptoms discussed by Agnes, as she is not only the organizer, but suffers from the disease. The local walk will take place at Ellicott Creek Park at noon. The Peace Bridge and Niagara Falls will be lit in purple to raise awareness.
