ISSUE: United Way of Buffalo & Erie County

DATE: April 1, 2018

DURATION: 28:00 (2 14-minute segments)

DESCRIPTION:

Discussed an overview of Gerard Place, who has programs funded by the United

Way of Buffalo and Erie County.

ISSUE: Furtastic Pet Adoption

DATE: April 8, 2018 DURATION: 28:00

DESCRIPTION:

Discussed what services are offered, the history of the organization, how it is funded, how it raises funds and fosters interest in pet adoption, discussed their upcoming event and how the community can learn more.

ISSUE: Autism Services INC

DATE: April 15, 2018 DURATION: 15:00

DESCRIPTION:

Discussed what Autism is, who it affects, does it affect 1 gender more than the other? Also discussed what causes it, if the MMR shot can cause autism, what are the ranges/spectrum of autism, what can Autism Services Inc do to help? What services do they offer? Do they help families? What is misunderstood about autism? There is the 8th annual Run the Burg for Autism coming up in June. People can register online. April is Autism Awareness Month.

ISSUE: Fantastic Friends of WNY Inc.

DATE: April 15, 2018 DURATION: 14:00

DESCRIPTION: Fantastic Friends of WNY Inc. is a volunteer organization that helps people with disabilities. The "friends" are volunteers who are paired with one of the disabled people during events. The ages of all the friends vary. The events include bowling, picnics, Get Air, craft making, etc. There is an event once a month. The organization is always looking for volunteers to help. These events also give the parents of the disabled child a 2 hour window of "freedom". Also the parents meet other parents of children with similar disabilities. Most of the kids in the program suffer from Autism. They also have offices in Downtown Buffalo.

ISSUE: CAMP Hope 2018 DATE: April 22, 2018 DURATION: 28:00

DESCRIPTION:

Discussed what Camp Hope is and who it serves, who is eligible to participate and receive services, what services hospice provides and what are the new collaborations, how they are funded, how the community can get more information and how to help with volunteerism and upcoming events.

ISSUE: Dr. Dubovsky's Update to WNY on CPEP and psychiatric service

DESCRIPTION:

Discussed the services CPEP provides, the urgent need for comprehensive psychiatric services, WNY has pediatric specialists, warning signs for depression in children, SAFE Act and danger in people not seeking services to avoid reporting, where to get help and how to get more information.

Discussed an overview of BPPN, who has program funded by the United Way of Buffalo and Erie County and participates in our annual Community Baby Shower.

DESCRIPTION:

Discussed the history and mission of Legal Services, the structure of collaboration between other agencies, some of the warning signs of elder abuse, the implications of guardianship changes for elderly people, how the community can get help and get more information and how the organization is funded.

DESCRIPTION:

Discussed the mission of the organization and the resources it provides, the symptoms, prognosis and status of current funded research, how the community can get more help, how one can find out more information and how this organization is funded.

ISSUE: Substance Abuse in our Community

DATE: May 27, 2018 DURATION: 14:00 DESCRIPTION:

Discussed the history and mission of Brylin (and additional options for services), the structure of collaboration between other agencies, how prevalent substance abuse is in our community and how the community can help and get more information, what can be done once abuse is identified and what treatment looks like and how are local mental health services funded.

ISSUE: KIA Memorial Road March

DATE: May 27, 2018 DURATION: 14:00

DESCRIPTION:

Discussed the mission of the organization and the resources it provides, how Jason (guest) got involved and what the first "march" was like, how the community can get more help, how one can find out more information and how the organization is funded.

ISSUE: United Way – Girl Scouts

DATE: June 3, 2018

DURATION: 28:00 (2 14 minute segments)

DESCRIPTION:

Discussed an overview of the Girl Scouts of WNY, who has programs funded by the United Way of Buffalo and Erie County.

ISSUE: Civil Air Patrol DATE: June 10, 2018 DURATION: 17:42

DESCRIPTION:

Major Luke told us what CAP is – an auxiliary unit of the US Air Force. They train cadets (students ages 12-21). They take part in community events. They also learn aerospace education, leadership and search and rescue. They actually assist the US military during natural disasters, etc. They obtain surveillance as well. They were formed just before the bombing of Pearl Harbor in WWII. It is open for males and females. They have different divisions across the nation and in NY state. They teach STEM program to the students. This program does NOT mean the volunteer has to enter the military. Major Luke describes how to get involved.

ISSUE: Junior League of Buffalo

DATE: June 10, 2018 DURATION: 10:00 DESCRIPTION:

Discussed what the Junior League is. They have been around since 1919. They are an organization that helps other organizations. They empower women, help families and help children. They are best known for their house they redecorate every year. That is a fundraiser which is their biggest of the year. They are

taking applications for grants this time of year. The deadline is December 1st. Danielle (guest) explained how to apply and who can apply. It is for non-profit organizations and is called the Community Assistance Small Grant.

ISSUE: Buffalo Prep DATE: June 17, 2018 DURATION: 14:00

DESCRIPTION:

Discussed what Buffalo Prep does and who they are. They have been around for 30 years. They help under services students get help in education and into a Prep high school and then onto college. Patti (guest) is especially proud f two board members who are former Buffalo Prep members. They recently received a national honor recently. Their mission is to provide access and preparation for talented, under-represented youth to achieve success in college preparatory high schools and higher education.

Discussed the history of Armed Forces Week, the annual activities in May to honor current service and veterans, special highlight for KIA, MIA and POW service members. 2018 featured Navy 2019 to feature Army (rotates). Also discussed how this organization helps the community (developed "Freedom Lounge" at airport), how they are funded and how the community can find out more.
