QUARTERLY ISSUES & PROGRAMS LIST

There follows a listing of some of the most significant issues responded to by station WEDG-FM, Buffalo, New York, along with the most significant programming treatment of those issues for the period July 1, 2018 through September 30, 2018. The listing is by no means exhaustive. The order in which the issues appear does not reflect any priority. The issues were covered on WEDG-FM's public affairs program on the dates indicated. The program is 30 minutes long and begins at 8:00am on Sundays.

ISSUE: United Way of Buffalo & Erie County DATE: July 1, 2018 DURATION: 28:00 (2 14-minute segments) DESCRIPTION: Discussed an overview of WNY United's Leaders in Training Program, funded by the United Way of Buffalo & Erie County

ISSUE: Olmstead Parks DATE: July 8, 2018 DURATION: 28:00 DESCRIPTION:

Discussed that the park system is celebrating 150 years this year. The 850 acres of parkland is run by the conservancy a not for profit agency. Events at the park include walking tours, free family movie night, West Side Bike Tour, golfing and picnicking. Events going on include pavers you can purchase, September 7th is the Gala and the S Park Arboretum restoration project. The 6 parks are connected and the park system includes 7 parkways, 8 circles and 4 smaller parks. Stephanie also talked about the history of the parks created by Frederick Law Olmstead.

ISSUE: Commission Burstein DATE: July 15, 2018 DURATION: 140:00 DESCRIPTION:

Discussed what this agency does, discussed medication assisted treatment and how this can help the problem, the most recent information on the issue of opiate overdoses in our community, rabies update, summer tic warnings and what to do if bitten, how the community can find out more and how they can help.

ISSUE: Forest Lawn DATE: July 15, 2018 DURATION: 13:00 DESCRIPTION:

Discussed the history of Forest Lawn and what it contributes to WNY, how they are funded, how to volunteer and support fundraising activities, new genealogical assistance and historic preservation and how the community can get more information.

ISSUE: Coast Guard Boating Safety DATE: July 22, 2018 DURATION: 14:04 DESCRIPTION:

Discussed Boating Safety. Nate talked about what is needed to operate a boat. Also – what pieces of equipment is necessary and are important to have. He also discussed the difference in rules for Personal Watercraft, the importance of a float plan and how it is good for someone on land to know that plan. The Coast Guard Auxiliary is also available to do checks of your vessel. They can help you with safety courses also.

ISSUE: Gateway Longview DATE: July 22, 2018 DURATION: 14:00 DESCRIPTION:

Melissa discussed the history of Gateway Longview and how it was started by a Pastor and used as a home for orphaned children. In the years since, they have expanded and now help children who are looking for foster care. They work to put the family's back together, and if that is not possible, they do help with adoption. They provide school, a campus for residential living, etc. They are helpful with older children who are aged "out" of foster care and were never adopted. Those young adults are helped with life skills and helped to set up to live on their own.

ISSUE: NYS Troopers DATE: July 29, 2018 DURATION: 28:00 DESCRIPTION: Discussed what the State Troopers do to help the community, 100th anniversary celebration and history of NYS troopers, how NYS police help people with identity theft, Super Bowl safety and driving sober, avoiding distraction when driving (no text, no earbuds) and how the community can learn more.

ISSUE: United Way Compass House – 2 segments DATE: August 5, 2018 DURATION: 28:00 (2 14-minute segments) DESCRIPTION: Discussed an overview of Compass House, funded by the United Way of Buffalo and Erie County.

ISSUE: Explore Buffalo DATE: August 12, 2018 DURATION: 14:00 DESCRIPTION: Discussed the mission of this organization and the resources it provides, how the community can get help, how to find out more information, how the organization is funded and how they need help from Buffalo to volunteer!

ISSUE: Dr. Dubovsky's Update to WNY on Videogaming Disorder DATE: August 19, 2018 DURATION: 14:00 DESCRIPTION: Discussed what videogaming is, the urgent need for comprehensive psychiatric services, WNY has pediatric specialists, warning signs for depression in children, where to get help and find out more information.

ISSUE: EC Health Fair

DATE: August 26, 2018 DURATION: 14:00 DESCRIPTION:

Erie County collaborates with Catholic Health, Best Self Behavioral, Endeavor Health Services and UB Dental. The services are open to residents or nonresidents of Erie County. There is a sliding scale when it comes to fees, and the will work with patients to apply for insurance or Medicaid. The UB Dental school has an office there as well and can take walk ins. They offer behavior, mental services to adults and youth. They are at 1500 Broadway in Buffalo.

ISSUE: Rocking Autism DATE: August 26, 2018 DURATION: 14:00 DESCRIPTION:

Discussed the mission of the organization, how it was founded and how it is funded, the type of community outreach is done to communicate to WNY, plans for the future and how community members can help, how they are trying to reduce the stigma of Autism and how the community can learn more.

ISSUE: United Way JAWNY Segments 1&2 DATE: September 2, 2018 DURATION: 28:00 (2 14 minute segments) DESCRIPTION: Discussed an overview Junior Achievement of WNY, funded by the United Way of Buffalo & Erie County

ISSUE: NFTA DATE: September 9, 2018 DURATION: 14:00 DESCRIPTION: Discussed the history and mission of the agency, the role of the canine division, the structure of collaboration between other agencies, how candidates are recruited for employment, how the community can help and get more information. ISSUE: Suicide Awareness/Suicide Survivors Day DATE: September 9, 2018 DURATION: 14:00 DESCRIPTION: Discussed the trends the agency is seeing, how to help a loved one, Crisis Services launches a new mobile team, upcoming Survivors of Suicide day in November, how one can find out more information and how the organization is funded.

ISSUE: Chiari Walk DATE: September 16, 2018 DURATION: 14:00 DESCRIPTION:

Agnes is not only the organizer of the walk, she is also a patient who suffers from Chiari. She explains what it is. (Chiari malformation is considered a congenital condition). Agnes has a fun walk planned to raise money and awareness for Chiari. She also talks about the symptoms of Chiari and that it is genetic (her daughter suffers from it).
