

QUARTERLY ISSUES & PROGRAMS LIST

There follows a listing of some of the most significant issues responded to by station WEDG-FM, Buffalo, New York, along with the most significant programming treatment of those issues for the period January 1, 2015 through March 31, 2015. The listing is by no means exhaustive. The order in which the issues appear does not reflect any priority. The issues were covered on WEDG-FM's public affairs program on the dates indicated. The program is 30 minutes long and begins at 6:00 AM on Sundays.

ISSUE: Lions Club International

DATE: January 4, 2015

DURATION: 14:00

DESCRIPTION:

Discussed the mission of the Lions Club, how people can get more information, how it is funded and supported by the community, scholarship program and recipients, collaboration with other organizations in the community and discussed services: eye screening, hearing aids, "Loan Closet" for wheelchairs, walkers and other durable medical equipment. Also discussed why you should drop off your glasses for re-use, no matter what condition they are in.

ISSUE: Project Future for Kids

DATE: January 4, 2015

DURATION: 14:00

DESCRIPTION:

Discussed the mission of Project Future, how people can get more information, how it is funded and supported by the community, scholarship program and recipients. Also discussed collaboration with the Niagara County Sheriff and defense training and fundraising Kickathon for kids in financial need.

ISSUE: 2015 Community Baby Shower

DATE: January 11, 2015

DURATION: 28:00 - (2) 14-minute segments

DESCRIPTION:

Guests discussed the 2015 Community Baby Show which engages the community in collecting new baby items such as diapers, onesies, sleep sacks, and digital thermometers. These items are distributed through the community agencies to new mothers experiencing financial difficulties.

ISSUE: Consumer Credit Counseling Service of Buffalo

DATE: January 18, 2015

DURATION: 20:00

DESCRIPTION:

Discussed the services CCCS Buffalo provides, how they are funded, how the community can get more information, how to get out of holiday debt and to plan for next year, how to stay out of danger, how to budget and what to save and that CCCS Buffalo is not just for emergency, use the services proactively.

ISSUE: Mental Health Awareness

DATE: January 18, 2015

DURATION: 7:30

DESCRIPTION:

Dr. Joseph Hullett talked about how many people in the United States suffer from mental illness. He further discussed that there is not just one specific demographic that is targeted more than others. He had mentioned what a person should do if they know someone who may suffer from a mental health illness and how to bring it up to them. Towards the end of the interview, he had talked about resources that people can contact in order to gather more information or to get help.

ISSUE: Broadway Market

DATE: January 25, 2015

DURATION: 13:00

DESCRIPTION:

Discussed the history of the market, the celebration to benefit the market for all future generations, Buffalo history and giving back, how the community can find more information, recap of Christmas activities and fundraising and how the community can help support their city market.

ISSUE: Amanda Hansen Foundation

DATE: January 25, 2015

DURATION: 14:00

DESCRIPTION:

Amanda was a happy, healthy 16-year old who spent the night at a friends' house and died after suffering Carbon Monoxide poisoning. Her death now serves as a reminder how deadly CO2 can be. It is a colorless, odorless gas that can kill. Her father – Ken talked about the dangers and how their mission is to educate the public and assist in giving away CO2 detectors and/or furnaces. They rely on the public for donations to keep helping those who need it.

DESCRIPTION:

Discussed that Cancer Services of Erie County helps with free screening. If you are uninsured or under insured – you can get a free screening. You do not need a referral. If additional diagnosis is needed, they can assist with that also.
