

## QUARTERLY ISSUES & PROGRAMS LIST

There follows a listing of some of the most significant issues responded to by station WEDG-FM, Buffalo, New York, along with the most significant programming treatment of those issues for the period July 1, 2016 through September 30, 2016. The listing is by no means exhaustive. The order in which the issues appear does not reflect any priority. The issues were covered on WEDG-FM's public affairs program on the dates indicated. The program is 30 minutes long and begins at 8:00 AM on Sundays.

**ISSUE: WNY Girls in Sports**

**DATE: July 3, 2016**

**DURATION: 28:00 – (2) 14-minute segments**

**DESCRIPTION:**

Overview of the WNY Day of Caring 2016.

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**ISSUE: Compeer**

**DATE: July 10, 2016**

**DURATION: 14:00**

**DESCRIPTION:**

Discussed that their mission is to use the power of volunteer friends to improve the lives of children and adults who are striving for good mental health. Each person on the Compeer Waitlist comes from different backgrounds, face different challenges, and bring individual personality to their situation. Compeer continues to promote "recovery through the healing power of friendship". They try to pair a volunteer with a person who is in need of a peer. Discussed what the Punt Foundation does and who they help. The mission of the PUNT Foundation is to provide children affected by cancer and their families with the opportunities and support to enjoy the life for which they fight so hard. They are having a Kan Jam tournament which is July 23<sup>rd</sup> at Ralph Wilson Stadium. It will raise money for the foundation. There are several programs the foundation supports. One is to help with expenses such as medical costs or (sadly) funeral costs. Another program is Game Day, Brian Moorman (who is behind the program) is a former Buffalo Bills player and "Brian's Game Day" program gives local children affected by cancer and their families the opportunity to attend a Bills home game in a private suite.

Discussed what the community needs to know about this historic resource, how they can help, what non-profit elements are factored into the programs, upcoming events, website navigation and plans for the future.

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**ISSUE: Border Patrol**

**DESCRIPTION:**

The US Border Patrol has a different job than the Customs agents – they patrol the border and keep our borders safe. They along the US/Canadian and US/Mexican border. They spend most of their time in boats. They make several arrests throughout the year when people try to illegally get into the US. They work closely with the Canadian agents. The citizens academy is open to folks who want to know more about Border patrol and learn what they do. They can shoot firearms and see what a real life encounter would be like! **DESCRIPTION:**

Discussed what State Troopers do to help the community, motorcycle safety and rules for those who ride, how to share the road – both autos and motorcycles – discussed equipment rules and updates/requirements, how to avoid distraction when driving (no text, no earbuds), and how the community can learn more.

**ISSUE: State Troopers Part 2**

**DATE: August 21, 2016**

**DURATION: 14:00**

**DESCRIPTION:**

Discussed what it takes to be a State Trooper – recruitment options – presence at the Erie County Fair – what they hope to accomplish; school programs Troopers offer, how the community can help and how the community can get more information.

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**ISSUE: Family Justice Center**

**DATE: August 28, 2016**

**DURATION: 28:00**

**DESCRIPTION:**

Discussed the forensic nurse who is now on staff. She sees women come in who are injured and some do not wish to press charges. The FCJ tries to help women come up with a plan when they feel they are being abused. The forensic nurse said 19% of the women she sees were strangled at some point. Some of these women still do not think they are in danger. The FJC is a “one stop shop” for abused women, from setting up court to restraining orders, etc.

**DESCRIPTION:**

Discussed what the CATCH program is, an initiative of the United Way of Buffalo & Erie County, that is implemented in Buffalo Public Schools.

**DESCRIPTION:**

Discussed the mission of this organization and the resources it provides, behaviors and risk factors for suicide, what to expect when one calls crisis services, how the community can get more help and find out more information and how this organization is funded.

Discussed new trends that the organization is seeing, how to help a loved one, the new Crisis Services Mobile Team, upcoming Survivors of Suicide Day – November 2016, how to find out more information and how this organization is funded.

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**ISSUE: Computers for Children**

**DURATION: 14:00**

**DESCRIPTION:**

Computers for Children is an agency that teaches kids and adults about computers. They can learn how to repair and fix machines, and also to build a computer from the ground up. They can also fix YOUR computer if there is an issue. They offer “camps” for kids in the summer. There are also many kids who only use computers for games, movies, etc, but at Computers for Children – they learn about software as well and software that may be useful in looking for a job. They can also record themselves on the “other” end of a job interview. John said there are a number of school age children who do not have computers in their home.

Dr. Teig is pushing the awareness of concussions especially when it comes to sports. He is training practices on how to incorporate the Sports Vision/High Performance Vision niche into their array of specialty services. He said sports are not the only way kids or adults suffer head trauma. Dr. Teig said a

concussion can result after what seems to be a subtle hit or injury. He states the symptoms to a concussion. He discusses the CTE diagnoses. And Dr. Teig talks about a conference that is taking place in October regarding concussion.
