WBAV 101.9FM Community Involvement 2nd Quarter 2013

--Each Year, WBAV and sister station WPEG put on an annual empowerment event—"For Sisters Only". It is designed to provide information, entertainment and a venue for authors, health practitioners and more to inner act with the community. Each year, several thousand pack Charlotte's Convention Center to be a part of the event.

--The annual Juneteenth Festival is a celebration of the pronouncement of freedom for all African Americans. That proclamation did not reach the state of Texas until June 19, 1865—two years after the Emancipation Proclamation. The event is celebrated in African American communities across the nation. WBAV 101.9fm & WBEP are annual media sponsors of this event and provide live coverage and extensive public service announcements.

--WBAV provides a monthly "Lunch & Learn" series hosted by mid-day on air talent Chirl Girl. At the event, various topics from business to social events are discussed by area experts. The event is attended each month by dozens interested in understanding living in Charlotte and networking with other business owners.

--Omega Psi Phi Annual Dr. Charles Drew Blood Drive—It is a signature event for the Omegas of Charlotte, and WBAV partners with the fraternity, providing media presence and a live broadcast. The event is the largest African-American blood drive event for the region.

--WBAV was also honored for the first time as a finalist in the National Association of Broadcaster's Crystal Awards, presented to outstanding stations for service provided to their communities. The station competed with hundreds of other broadcasters nationwide to become a finalist in its first attempt.

Each weekday morning from 5:20am — 6:00am, News & Public Affairs Director Beatrice Thompson anchors “The Front Page with Beatrice Thompson”—a live news and interview program.

The program is a strong lead in for the #1 rated “Steve Harvey Morning Show”.

Local & regional community leaders are interviewed on the program each morning for a time span that last from 4 to 6 minutes. Interviews are live and pre-recorded.

Topics selected pertain to events impacting the community...topics of interest to the community from health, to community relations, the arts, education, community fundraisers, business updates.

The format also provides a vehicle for WBAV to showcase events the station forms community partnerships with—providing additional coverage for the event—and information to the community.

WBAV 101.9FM Public Service Announcements 2nd Quarter 2013

Each week, WBAV 101.9FM receives dozens of request for air time in the form of public service announcements (PSA's).

WBAV 101.9FM makes use of three different commercial positions -- :60 second; :30 second & a special partnership :30 second spot to provide on-air exposure for community and non-profit groups to get their message to the public. These spots have now been divided into :15 sec. increments – increasing the rotation & number of times the public can receive this information.

Public Service Announcements are also read on air during community programs—The Front Page & Straight Talk. During each air shift, on-air personalities also read information from the public announcement listings, providing coverage for the organizations in all time periods during which WBAV 101.9FM is on the air.

An organization's public service announcements will be aired during a minimum one week rotation, with more exposure determined by the number of submissions received in the community affairs department.

Organizations are asked to submit their public service announcements a minimum of two weeks in advance of their event, in order to be considered for the on-air rotation of public announcements.
