WRWB-FM provides its listeners with programming and public service announcements that address issues of concern to our local community. Among the issues determined to be of most concern to the community during the preceding calendar quarter were:

- **Artist:** Public artist Franc Palaia talks about his murals throughout Poughkeepsie and how it beautifies the city as well organizing public art for collaborative projects.
- **ChangePoint Theater, community:** Jacques Patel, Executive Director, and Anne Lucccente, Media Coordinator, of ChangePoint Theater discussed their involvement in the organization, the origin of the community based organization, what it has to offer, past and upcoming shows, what the future holds and how the public can get involved.
- **Charities :** Christina Boryck, Executive Director of Rebuilding Together Dutchess County and Mike Mulaney, owner of Hudson Cadillac, Buick, GMC, discussed the upcoming Poughkeepsie Rotary 8th Annual Car Show at the Mid Hudson Civic Center, how they became involved in the Rotary, the Rotary's purpose, successes and opportunities.
- **Community :** Dutchess County Vet2 Vet Program
- **Community - Poughkeepsie Arts Commission:** Sarah Wilson, Chair of Poughkeepsie Arts Commission and also an Attorney in Poughkeepsie talks about her commitments as Chair of the Poughkeepsie Public Art Commission, a seven member advocacy and advisory board promoting local arts. She discussed the O+ (O Positive), a medical initiative supporting artists: the Art Effect with its upcoming international youth film festival, "Reel Expressions" on April 6th and new plans for the "ARTerial" which is art along Poughkeepsie's main arterial highway. Ms. Wilson also tells of her own journey from being an art history major at Michigan State to a career as an arts lawyer at a major law firm in Poughkeepsie.
- **Community History:** A discussion on the memory and art of the community unfolding to reveal the nature and history of the community. Also a discussion about Lateff island, John Flowers and individual like Tice Asungton and Sandy Ludlum who embody the qualities of those who passed.
- **Community Involvement:** Joe spoke about his education and background in communications and his 40th year in radio in the Hudson Valley. Joe also spoke about all the charity and public service organizations that he was been involved with over his forty years, the impact that local

radio has on the community and what changes he has seen and been apart of.

- **Community Services:** John Tumminia, founder of the Baseball Miracle Foundation, discussed the history and mission of the foundation which is to bring the game of baseball to deserving children around the world. Through this they teach the children valuable life lessons, provide communities with resources to help children play safely and confidently and most importantly bring some light into their lives. This is all done through their core values of Servitude, Teamwork, Enjoyment and Excellence. John also spoke on the sixteen trips that they have already taken, opportunities of local volunteers and where they are going from here.
- **DC Interfaith Center:** Lorraine talked about the power of stories for religious traditions and the every day ordinary life. She also spoke about The Story Circle of the Dutchess County Interfaith Council which shares story and faith throughout the county.
- **Earth Wind & Fuego:** talks about creating a for profit enterprise that works with homeless to get training
- **Education:** Carol Melton & Jennifer Howard, both teachers at the Morse Elementary School in Poughkeepsie NY discussed the First African American Read-I on 2-26-19. All are invited to this educational event which is primarily designed for children. The Poet Gold will also perform at the event.
- **Family Services:** Loule Gebremedhin, Associate Director of Human Services at Family Services, a multi-service, multi-county agency centered in Poughkeepsie, describes the agency's community leadership in combating structural racism, by examining its own bias. She also tells of her own family's distinct story as Ethiopians who came to America when she was two years old. This gave her an upbringing with a special awareness to the challenges of immigrants and insight into how America handles difference on an individual and community level.
- **Government & Community:** Dutchess County Executive Marc Molinaro talks about the State of the County address, the County Park System - how it operates and the new park additions. He also spoke about the tourism in the county, the upcoming tourism season and how it's grown. Marc also spoke about the Think Differently program which is a program whose initiative seeks to change the way individuals, businesses, organizations and communities relate to our neighbors with all abilities and how well it is doing.
