Ms. Earl & Jasper County Archivist Steve Weldon discussed voter apathy & wishing to encourage voters in our market to register to vote & then to actually vote. Mr. Weldon wrote 2 evergreen public service campaigns to use for the 2008 primary & general election & to keep for future elections. On Tuesday, July 15, 2008 Vance & Commercial Videographer Krystal Phillips spent a day videotoping for the PSA's. Then on July 16 Sonya Parker completed post-production on the PSA's. The first public service announcement is titled "Sacrifice" & suggests if citizens don't vote they are ignoring the sacrifice our service men & women have made on their behalf. The second PSA is titled "I Vote" & features various demographies exclaiming "I Vote" & "I Vote, Do You?" The production & airing of the PSA's was done at no-charge. 
# Power of 7 Survey Results July 2008





- Paid service: Subscribe to cable, satellite or a telephone company service provider to continue using your

The Mangano's and their staff saved 24 of the residents and got them to safety, but the wall of water and its aftermath left 35 of the residents dead. But when the bodies were discovered at the nursing home, no one thought of the Manganos as heroes. Having been evacuated to Texas, Sal and Mabel returned to Louisiann, where they were each arrested and charged with 35 counts of negligent homicide and 24 counts of cruelty to the infirm. Prosecutors claimed that the Manganos had no intention of evacuating, based on the inadequate evacuation plan on file with the state; the fact that the other three mursing homes in the parish had made the decision to evacuate; that the parish government adequately stressed the importance of evacuation; that telephone calls made by parish officials to the Manganos went unheeded; and that the Manganos turned down an offer of buses to help evacuate their residents. At the trial, several family members of the deceased testified that the Manganos had told them they would evacuate the mursing frome before Hurricane Katrina struck - something both Sal and Mabel deny. The defense strategy was to make the trial about the government failures that led to the flooding of St. Bernard Parish – and it was successful: they were both found not guilty on 118 counts. With Lesa dead, investigators quickly focused on drugs. At her apartment, detectives discovered used syringes with traces of expendence  $\rightarrow$  a powerful narcotic used to kill pain and available only from a prescribing physician. After a five month investigation. Dr. Koulis was arrested on four charges -- ranging from simple assault to second degree morder. At the trial, prosecutors alleged Dr. Koulis had injected Less with expendence during the course of the weekend, which eventually led to her death, But the defense claimed Lesa injected herself, and that she had a drug problem - a claim her family and investigators disputed. Ultimately, Dr. Koulis was found guilty of criminally negligent homicide. Ite will likely remain free until 2009, pending his appeal. Investigators questioned Kevin and he agreed to take a polygraph. which he failed. That, along with Kevin's palm print in Nona's blood on the unreder weapon, kept the investigation focused on Kevin. Police believed that he flew into a murderous rage when he discovered a condem wrapper on her kitchen counter. After police questioned and cleared Nona's other sexual partners, Kevin became their only suspect. At the trial, prosecutors based their case on the blood evidence found on the light bulb. However, the texture of the blood was crucial to the case and police described. it as being tacky. That description supported the defense claim that the print was left when Nona's body was discovered and was still sticky when police arrived at the crime. scene. The jury agreed and Kevin Jones was found not guilty. Recently, Kevin's defense team found a match to the DNA found on the condom wrapper and a special prosecutor has been appointed to look into the case.
