A different crime is outlined in a new segment each week with information about the crime, suspect and reward.

<u>KSKS MORNING SHOW:</u> Interviews on the KSKS morning show with representatives of community groups covering issues of concern and interest to the Valley. Dates, times, and subjects are listed under pertinent issue headings.

KSKS PUBLIC SERVICE ANNOUNCEMENTS: :60, :30 and :10 second recorded or live announcements scheduled to run 7 days a week at various times during the day for the entire 1st quarter. If the announcements covered a significant issue of concern to the Valley and ran for a significant amount of time, it is listed under the pertinent issues heading with details. As secretary of Defense, Dr. Perry galvanized efforts to secure nuclear stockpiles inherited by former Soviet states and presided over the dismantlement of more than 8,000 nuclear weapons.

In 2007, Dr. Perry, George Shultz, Sam Nunn and Henry Kissinger together formed the Nuclear Security Project, to share the vision of a world free from nuclear weapons with urgent but practical steps that can be taken immediately to reduce nuclear dangers.
