RADIO QUARTERLY ISSUES/PROGRAMS LISTING

Requirements: Sections 73.3526(e)(12) and 73.3527(e)(8) of the FCC's rules require that every three months each radio broadcast station prepare a listing of programs that have provided by the station to address and treat the most significant community issues during the preceding three month period. The list for each calendar quarter is to be filed by the tenth (10th) day of the succeeding calendar quarter (e.g., January 10 for the quarter October through December, April 10 for the quarter January through March, etc.).

1. **Local News** – Detailed police reports, as well as cover meeting and press conferences on our community. Our local news is presented weekdays at 5:30AM, 6AM, 6:30AM, 7AM, 7:30AM, 8AM, 8:30AM. And at 12 Noon, 4, 5 and 6 PM. Each news cast lasts between 3 and 5 minutes.
2. **Promote Education Awareness** – One of Halifax County's "Vision 20/20" identified needs for our community was an educated workforce. We've pledged to support that effort by promoting the value of a better education. WHLF management believes one of the best ways to help our community become a better place to live is to improve the economic conditions of our citizens. The best way to accomplish that is to help drive the raise awareness of how to obtain for a quality education here in our community. WHLF has partnered with the Southern Virginia Higher Education Center to regularly promote Educational and Job training and re-training opportunities in our community.
3. **Toys For Tots & Operation Christmas Angel** –WHLF again partnered with Farm Credit to Promote Toys for Tots donations. And WHLF has also promoted the Halifax County Department of Social Services Angel Tree Locations and deadlines.
4. **WHLF Happenings**, these are regularly scheduled local Public Service Announcements, which air 16 times a day between 5:50 AM and 11PM. These are locally produced announcements that Promoted Community Events.
5. **THE BREAKFAST CLUB**, a Community Communications Platform, we address this need with an open invitation to come and spend 5 to 10 minutes with us at 7:05AM and promote any community event (with a focus on non-profits). Our list of guest this quarter included ... See Details Below.
