ISSUES: KPAN AM-FM has identified issues affecting Deaf Smith Electric Cooperative as an issue impacting the county. The utility is facing issues across its service area as the wind industry moves into the region. KPAN also identified the pending opening of a branch campus of Amarillo College as an issue, with numerous new opportunities being presented for local students.

KPAN has identified a lack of a credible news source for the local Hispanic community as an ongoing issue facing Deaf Smith County. The county is about 60% Hispanic, and the public schools approach 80% Hispanic. Although much of the Latino population is bi-lingual, a large minority speaks and understands only Spanish. Their only source of local news is KPAN AM-FM.

PROGRAMS: KPAN AM-FM interviewed Steve Horrell of Deaf Smith Electric at 8:45am March 11, and discussed operations of DSEC. The utility's general manager, Mike Veazey, was interviewed at 8:45am March 20 and discussed a myriad of issues, and operational and financial results during the past year. News stories were also broadcast January 8, February 28, March 11, March 18 and March 19. Amarillo College director Daniel Esquivel was interviewed at 8:45am January 30 to discuss new programs available at the AC campus, and AC president Dr. Paul Matney was interviewed at 8:45am February 13 to discuss opportunities for local students, along with integration of the Hereford campus into the AC system.

The content of the KPAN RadioGram is translated into Spanish by Josie Nava and broadcast weekdays at 6:30pm during the Spanish-language program. The KPAN RadioGran is published online 6 days a week, and is published and distributed weekdays to 25 outlets in Hereford. It is the basis for 6 daily news report during English-language broadcasts on KPAN. A few copies from this quarter are attached.

WEATHER: (January 28, 2014) TUESDAY – High yesterday afternoon was 27 at 4:00; this morning's low was 4 above zero at 7:30. KPANcast: Continued cold.

LOCAL: A fire at King's Manor Methodist Home Monday night destroyed the kitchen and caused the evacuation of the facility, but no injuries were reported. Over 60 residents of King's Manor and Westgate were wheeled across the street in 10 degree weather to Northwest Elementary by first responders, volunteers and King's Manor staff. The evacuees spent the night with nearby family, at Hereford Nursing and Rehab and at Castro County Nursing and Rehab in Dimmitt........The fire started in a storage room near the kitchen and thick smoke filled the facility. Numerous local residents pitched in to help during the fire, and Hereford ISD provided busses for the trip to Dimmitt. Everyone is reported safe and sound today........Deaf Smith County commissioners approved a 10-year property tax reduction plan for Unity Wind LLC, which has proposed a 200-megawatt wind ranch in eastern Deaf Smith County north of Dawn. The county will receive payments in-lieu-of-taxes during the 10 year period.......The 3-4 Lady Whitefaces host the 5-2 Monterey Plainswomen in 4-4A basketball at 6:00 today at Whiteface Gym, followed by the 7:30 game between the 4-1 Plainsmen and the 2-3 Herd boys. KPAN AM-FM will have live coverage.......The Herd girls took their 3<sup>rd</sup> straight 4-4A wrestling title Saturday in Vernon and the Herd boys placed second. 

ISSUES: KPAN AM-FM has identified a proposal to expand municipal water rights by the City of Hereford as a substantial issue facing the community. The issue has many facets and three public hearings are being held. KPAN also identified the construction of the EDF wind project southeast of Hereford as an issue facing residents.

KPAN has identified a lack of a credible news source for the local Hispanic community as an ongoing issue facing Deaf Smith County. The county is about 60% Hispanic, and the public schools approach 80% Hispanic. Although much of the Latino population is bi-lingual, a large minority speaks and understands only Spanish. Their only source of local news is KPAN AM-FM.

PROGRAMS: KPAN AM-FM interviewed Hereford mayor Bob Josserand in a half-hour segment at 8:45am May 29 to discuss various aspects of the water rights expansion proposal. KPAN also provided extensive coverage of the three public hearings, with detailed news stories broadcast May 6, 17, 19, 20, 31; and June 2, 3, 16 and 17. KPAN interviewed Ben Ludwig of EDF Renewables in a half-hour segment at 8:45am June 27 and discussed various aspects of the wind park construction. News stories on the EDF project were broadcast April 4 and 10; May 3 and 5; and June 7, 23, 26 and 27.

WEATHER: (June 7, 2014) SATURDAY – High yesterday afternoon was 89 at 4:00; this morning's low was 61 at 7:00. KPANcast: Humid with a 50% chance of thunderstorms, some possibly severe.

LOCAL: Large wind turbine components began arriving this week for the first commercial wind ranch in Deaf Smith County, with wind turbine blades, nacelles and pedestal sections trucked to the site of Texas Hereford Wind LLC southeast of Hereford. The 200-megwatt project is being developed by EDF Renewables, which operates the Spinning Spur installations in Oldham County and has numerous other projects underway in the region.....The huge pieces are shipped to a staging area at FM 2943 and County Road 4, then moved to individual turbine sites. Blattner Energy is the contractor for the project and has about 200 employees in the area......Authorities ruled Friday that the death of Hugo Villarreal, age 41, at his trailer house Wednesday was the result of a self-inflicted knife wound. The body of Villarreal was found by his sister Wednesday afternoon; an autopsy revealed he died after a knife wound to an artery of his arm......San Jose Catholic Church holds its annual Jamaica Sunday from noon-8:00 at Dameron Park with live music, a variety of food and drinks, a car show, raffles and games. The community is invited......Severe thunderstorms cruised the region Friday afternoon and overnight with big lightning, damaging wind, heavy rain and some small hail. An 83 mph wind gust was recorded at 8:50pm at the SchoolNet site at HISD Admin Building, with wind gusts over 50 mph observed at other locations in Hereford. Rainfall totals include 1.05 inch at Bootleg, 0.50 inch at Dimmitt, 0.65 at Bar G at Summerfield and 0.29 at KPAN in downtown Hereford. Another round of gnarly storms is forecast for today and tonight.

LOCAL: EDF Renewable Energy and its contractor, Blattner Energy, will begin erecting 250-foot wind turbines by the end of July at Texas Hereford Wind, which is located on 15,000 acres of farm and ranch land southeast of Hereford. Components for 20 complete turbines are on the ground at various pedestal sites, and the huge construction cranes are being assembled at a site on FM 1259.......EDF also operates the Spinning Spur wind installations in Oldham County and is building the \$340 million, 200-megawatt facility southeast of Hereford to produce power to be consumed downstate on the ERCOT grid......Tee-off is 7:30 Saturday morning for the 11<sup>th</sup> annual Tierra Blanca Classic golf tournament at Pitman Golf Course. and the same of the WEATHER: (June 28, 2014) SATURDAY – High yesterday afternoon was 96 at 5:00 with southwest wind to 30 mph; this morning's low was 67 at 7:00. KPANcast: Sunny and hot.

LOCAL: The city of Canyon won the contest to locate a specialty milk powder plant that will process 40 loads of fresh milk daily from area dairies. Lone Star Milk Producers announced Friday that Canyon will be the site of the new facility, which will employ 60 persons and produce annual payroll of \$3.5 million. Lone Star will produce various premium powders, ingredients for infant formula, cream, butter and condensed milk, and process about 2 million pounds of fresh milk daily.....Lone Star is made up of 170 individual dairy farms in 9 states, with most of its milk volume coming from Texas. The company plans to begin construction this fall, possibly at a site west of Canyon near US 60. The plant will incorporate technology to separate potable water from the milk, and about 90,000 gallons of water a day will be available to irrigate athletic fields or other public property in Canyon.....The 11th annual Tierra Blanca Classic is underway today and Sunday at Pitman Golf Course. There are 115 teams entered in the 36-hole, 2person scramble; the golf course is closed to the public this weekend.......Funeral mass for Guadalupe Tapia, age 82, is at 10:00 this morning at San Jose Mission, with burial at St. Anthony's Catholic Cemetery......Funeral mass for Jimmy Valdez, age 85, will be at 2:00 Monday at San Jose Catholic Church. He was a retired fuel truck driver who died Thursday......Boy Scout Troop 52 will hold a spaghetti dinner fundraiser Sunday 11:30-2:00 at Hereford Community Center; tickets are \$12 at the door.
