ISSUES: KPAN AM-FM has identified a lack of awareness and support for the local community blood bank drives as a community issue. The project, associated with Coffee Memorial Blood Center in Amarillo, has had varying degrees of support and promotion from several sponsoring agencies and ad hoc groups. A new local committee is working to energize the project.

KPAN has identified a lack of a credible news source for the local Hispanic community as an ongoing issue facing Deaf Smith County. The county is about 60% Hispanic, and the public schools approach 80% Hispanic. Although much of the Latino population is bi-lingual, a large minority speaks and understands only Spanish. Their only source of local news is KPAN AM-FM.

PROGRAMS: KPAN AM-FM broadcast in-depth interviews at 8:45am July 25 and September 26 with Julie Butler, the chairperson of the local blood drive committee. In addition, numerous daily reminders were broadcast on days of the local blood drives in July and September, and detailed news stories were broadcast July 26, 27; and September 27, 28.

The content of the KPAN RadioGram is translated into Spanish by Josie Nava and broadcast weekdays at 6:30pm during the Spanish-language program. The KPAN RadioGram is published online 6 days a week and is posted to Facebook 6 days a week as well. It is published and distributed weekdays to 25 outlets in Hereford. It is the basis for 6 daily news report during English-language broadcasts on KPAN. A few copies from this quarter are attached.

The 2100-pound combo bin of boneless beef trim was produced September 14, and further processed into ground beef products by WinCo Foods of Duncanville. The contamination was detected by routine testing by the USDA Agricultural Marketing Service, and all but 320 pounds of the ground beef has been accounted for......Retail gasoline prices bumped up two cents a gallon in Texas this week to an average of \$1.97, with a nationwide price of \$2.21. Prices in Hereford are at \$1.83-1.89...... Funeral mass for Eluterio "Chito" Mariscal, age 84, is at 11:00 Saturday at St. Anthony's Catholic Church. 

LOCAL: Hereford city commissioners Monday adopted a \$9.6 million general fund budget by a 5-1 vote, with commissioner Angie Alonzo voting against the measure. The budget will be partly funded by a 5.4% property tax increase of 33 cents per hundred dollar valuation. City commissioners also approved 3% increases in municipal water supply and sewer rates and a 1.5% increase in trash collection rates, and accepted a bid from Jim Hund to dryland farm a section of municipal land northeast of Hereford owned for water supply expansion......Deaf Smith County commissioners unanimously adopted a \$6.9 million budget for fiscal 2016-17 Monday. The spending will be partly funded by a 3.9% property tax rate increase to 53 cents per hundred dollar valuation......The 18-12 Lady Herd faces the 27-3 Randall Lady Raiders in 3-5A volleyball tonight at Raider Gym. Randall and Amarillo are tied for the district lead, and Randall is ranked #1 in Texas in 5A volleyball. The match starts at 7:00 with live coverage on KPAN AM-FM...... The Hereford Elks' Lodge Sweetheart auction, BBQ dinner and dance starts at 6:00 Saturday at the Elks Lodge. Tickets are \$15 and proceeds go to Elks' programs for special-needs kids in Texas...... 

LOCAL: The U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service Tuesday officially removed the lesser prairie-chicken from the federal list of endangered and threatened wildlife, fulfilling a 2015 Federal Court ruling that the agency had not adequately considered a multi-state habitat conservation plan before designating the species as "threatened". The agency said it would continue to study and evaluate whether the bird warrants federal protection......The lesser prairie-chicken has been considered a species in trouble for two decades, in part because of habitat encroachment across its five-state range, which includes far western Deaf Smith County......Online registration for returning HISD students continues at www.herefordisd.net. On-site registration for pre-K students is July 26, and onsite registration for kindergarten through 12 graders will be held August 4-5. Parents can alleviate some of the time-consuming process of paper registration by signing up in advance online......USDA Secretary Tom Vilsack is reportedly on the short list as a potential running mate for Hillary Clinton. He is a former governor of Iowa who was appointed agriculture secretary in 2009......Funeral services are pending at Hereford Heritage for Florence Vaught, age 99, who died yesterday in Hereford......Funeral services for Rayburn Strange, age 82, will be at 10:00 Thursday at Avenue Baptist Church. 



LOCAL: With 49.6% of registered voters casting ballots, Deaf Smith County went 69% for Donald Trump in the presidential race Tuesday. Voters elected Chris Woodard to the Deaf Smith Hospital Board with 1417 votes, with three incumbents re-elected: Harold McNutt with 1320, June Rudd with 1086 and Debbie Gonzalez with 1046. Sheriff J. Dale Butler was re-elected with 2,358 votes to challenger Fidel Reyna's 328.......The Lady Whitefaces put up a great battle but lost to Randall in the 5A volleyball playoff match Tuesday in Amarillo, 26-24, 27-25, 25-17. Meagan Ellis had 16 kills and 5 digs, and Chandler Vogel had 6 aces, 15 set assists and 5 digs. Randall advances to the regional tournament with a 38-5 record, while the Lady Herd ends its season at 28-16........The outdoor burn ban has been temporarily lifted for Deaf Smith County until 8:00am Friday. Outdoor fires are allowed if weather conditions allow for a safe, controlled burn.......Funeral mass for Joe Balderaz, age 70, will be at 10:00 Thursday at San Jose Catholic Church. He was a Hereford resident since 1969 who died Monday; he had worked over 20 years for Hereford ISD.......The final day of the 26th annual Festival of Trees is today until 3:00 at Hereford Senior Center....... 

LOCAL: Beginning Sunday, the nation's livestock producers will have restricted access to antibiotic drugs that have been available over-the-counter. The Food and Drug Administration is implementing the veterinary feed directive, which requires livestock producers to gain approval from a vet before purchasing some antibiotics. The change is in response to concerns that heavy antibiotic usage is leading to the development of bacterial strains that are resistant to drug treatment.......Many of the drugs will still be available with a veterinary feed directive, which is like a prescription for livestock. Beef cattle feedlot operations could be among the most affected, since antibiotic use in dairies is already heavily regulated.......In the Union Square Christmas Classic in Burkburnett Wednesday, the Lady Whitefaces defeated Snyder 67-22 with 16 points from Lori Arias; then beat Mineral Wells 58-44 with 14 points by Lindsey Carrillo. Hereford is 7-10 for the season and has games against Paradise and Burkburnett today.......At the Byron Johnston Holiday Classic in Midland, Odessa High defeated the Hereford Whitefaces 70-49 with 21 points from Parker Lowrey.
