ISSUES: KPAN AM-FM has identified the process of adopting a new federal 5-year Farm Bill as an issue facing the community. Parts of the existing legislation have worked well, but several groups are seeking tweaks in federal farm policy; in addition, cotton farmers were left out entirely as a covered crop in the existing Farm Bill.

KPAN has identified a lack of a credible news source for the local community as an ongoing issue facing Deaf Smith County. The local newspaper has cut issues from five to two days a week, has frequent staff turnover or understaffing, often lacks perspective and objectivity, and is widely ignored by local residents.

PROGRAMS: KPAN AM-FM broadcast an in-depth interview at 8:45am on August 3 with Dale Artho, a Deaf Smith County commissioner and farm leader who testified at a hearing in San Angelo August 1. He discussed numerous issues related to federal farm policy. KPAN conducted an interview at 8:45am August 28 with Randall County Extension agent J.D. Ragland, with a preview of a meeting in Canyon and discussion of farm policy issues. In addition, KPAN AM-FM provided news coverage of Farm Bill issues July 3, 12, 13, 26, 29; August 1, 2, 23; and September 26.

The KPAN RadioGram is part of an effort to fill the vacuum left when the local newspaper cut its frequency and resources devoted to local news. The KPAN RadioGram is published online 6 days a week and is posted to Facebook 6 days a week as well. It is published and distributed weekdays to 25 outlets in Hereford. LOCAL: The City of Hereford Monday unveiled plans to demolish the existing Community Center and construct a new civic center on West 15th Street. City commissioners Monday looked at floor and site plans for a 24,000 squarefoot facility that would cost about \$6.7 million to construct. The firm Parkhill, Smith and Cooper of Amarillo has been hired as architect and artist's renderings of the project are on display at City Hall.......City manager Rick Hanna said the current Community Center has several structural issues. KPAN Radio again is the sponsor for the Christmas Stocking Fund, a local holiday charity that provides assistance to less-fortunate residents during the holidays.

The local newspaper has cut issues from five to two days a week, has frequent staff turnover or understaffing, often lacks perspective and objectivity, and is widely ignored by local residents.

PROGRAMS: KPAN AM-FM broadcast an interview at 8:45am on November 1 with Hereford Senior Citizens director Gina Burdette and staff member Lyn Rayburn. Several topics were discussed, including operation of the HSC Thrift Store and the upcoming fund-raiser the Festival of Trees. LOCAL: The Hereford Whitefaces were unable to effectively stop the Bulldog rushing game and an early missed extra-point loomed large as Plainview defeated the Herd 21-20 Friday in the homecoming football game at Whiteface Stadium. The game was delayed by lightning for over an hour at halftime.......Plainview put up a 10-yard TD pass on 4th down just before half to take a 14-13 lead, then took the lead against in the 4th quarter. The Herd drove deep but missed a field goal with 3:02 remaining in the game, and the Bulldogs took over and ran out the clock......Seth Dixon had another huge night with 34 carries for 199 yards and a TD, and a 25-yard pass reception for another TD.
