Quarterly Issues/Programs List

WNTM provides its listeners with programming and public service announcements that address issues of concern to our local community. Among the issues determined to be of most concern to the community during the preceding calendar quarter were:

HEALTH & SAFETY: By far the biggest issue affecting our listeners during the 2nd Quarter of 2020 was the COVID-19 pandemic. The pandemic encompassed health issues, mental health issues, safety issues, economic/workplace issues, hunger issues and more. iHeart Media responded with public affairs programming touching all of these factors amid the Coronavirus crisis. In addition, talent shared local information with listeners on air, on social media, and on the station's website, including plans for reopening after quarantine.

Severe Weather Preparedness: With 2 named storms prior to the June 1st start of the Atlantic hurricane season and a 3rd during the first week, meteorologist Alan Sealls talks about what to expect from a season that's predicted to be above average. He explains the terms used during hurricane season, including the Saffir-Simpson scale for storm categories, and explains the different storm hazards (wind, surge, flooding, tornados) that come with a tropical cyclone.

LOCAL NONPROFITS: WNTM's Uncle Henry (along with WMXC's Mary Booth) used the Ask The Expert program to highlight how businesses were dealing with the pandemic, but several of those segments focused on local nonprofits, many of which were having to totally revamp their methods of serving the community. Some were able to switch to virtual services; some had to cancel programs; and some had to ramp up programs because the needs in the community were greater. Almost all faced fundraising issues, since events that fund many of their projects were canceled due to COVID-19. Nonprofits interviewed included Habitat for Humanity, United Way, BBB, SPCA, Mobile Baykeeper, Bank On South Alabama, Visit Mobile, Alabama Kidney Foundation, and Victory Health Partners.
