Quarterly Issues/Programs List

WNTM provides its listeners with programming and public service announcements that address issues of concern to our local community. Among the issues determined to be of most concern to the community during the preceding calendar quarter were:

- **Disabilities:** UCP Christmas Nights of Lights 5K Run. Miranda Lambert (A Development Specialist with UCP's Childcare Enhancement With a Purpose Program or CCEP), and Kaley Keith (A Program Coordinator for UCP's Supported Employment Program), along with Lauren Luckie, Development Director, talk about the various programs offered by United Cerebral Palsy in Mobile. One program (CCEP) helps childcares learn how to include children with developmental disabilities; the other program helps adults with UCP get jobs and keep them, by having training coaches to work alongside them until they are confident in their duties, and then keep up with them as long as they continue the job. Other programs offered include early intervention, preschool, respite, adult day program, and Camp Smile. This 5K through the Christmas lights at Hank Aaron stadium helps fund these local programs.
- **Government:** Alabama State Treasurer John McMillan talks about the role of the State Treasurer's office, including programs to help save for college tuition or to help those with disabilities maintain their independence and quality of life. There's also an Unclaimed Property program to help find the owners of abandoned bank accounts, safe deposit boxes, insurance awards and more. Treasurer McMillan talked about how the robust economy is helping the state's bottom line.
- **Health:** Virginia Guy of the Drug Education Council and Dr. Karen Fagan with USA Health University Hospital talk about the recent upswing in lung problems related to vaping and why it's a misconception that vaping is healthy for you, compared to smoking. Dr. Fagan talks about known risk factors and the many unknowns with vaping, especially since it's not regulated. They talk about how easy it is for teens to get vaping materials and hide them from parents and teachers. **ALSO:** iHeartRadio's A Look Into Diabetes: Genetics and Prevention takes a closer look at what it means to live with diabetes, the risk factors of pre-diabetes and the role genetics play in preventing and understanding the disease better

Healthcare: Kim Garrett and Ira Bates, Victory Health Partners, explain how this clinic in Mobile provides care for working adults (19 to 65) who can't afford insurance. The clinic provides healthcare services for a \$35 to \$55 co-pay (based on income) including tests, x-rays, and some medications. Over 150 local specialists partner with Victory Health to also provide specialty care with an affordable co-pay, either at the clinic or at their regular offices. Victory Health Partners was started as a faith-based program by a local surgeon who enlisted other healthcare professionals to help bridge the gap between Medicaid and Medicare, for those who don't qualify for either program but can't afford insurance and traditional healthcare.

- **MENTAL HEALTH:** Lifelines Counseling Services Bay Area Brunch Fest at Bienville Square helps raise money to support Lifelines programs in Mobile. Lifelines offers crisis services for rape victims, suicide support, homicide support; family counseling for mental/emotional wellness, marital and divorce counseling, grief counseling, and behavioral/emotional counseling for children; credit counseling for those buying homes or needing help with debt/credit; and they operate United Way's 2-1-1 help line.

POLITICS: State and national politics, including the latest on the impeachment of President Trump; analyzing the Democratic candidates for President; examining the Alabama Senate race (with candidates Bradley Byrne and Tommy Tuberville discussing the issues they are focusing on in their campaigns)

- **Public Safety:** Alabama State Trooper Lt Joe Piggott talks about holiday traffic heading into Thanksgiving and what we need to stay safe on the roads. He discusses new laws, including the anti-road rage law that requires drivers to drive in the right lane unless passing. There's also a new law that requires everyone in the car to use a seat belt. Lt Piggott described how an unbelted backseat passenger can injure a driver or front seat passenger in a collision. **ALSO:** Kevin Levy, Commander of the Cyber Division for Mobile Police Department and cyber specialist Jeremiah Moody discuss ways to protect yourself online and in your home from cyber criminals during the holidays, as well as traditional safety tips for those going to local stores to shop.
- **Volunteerism:** Wallace Davis, Amanda Gonzalez talk about VOA's (Volunteers of America) mission and 20 years of Uplifting Moments presented by Davis on our Mobile iHeart Radio stations. The Uplifting

Moments program was designed to help bring positive change and bring our community together. VOA offers numerous services locally, including services for Veterans, Seniors, Disabled, Homeless, as well as families and children, helping them overcome challenges to lead productive, healthy lives.
