Description: Insights on PBS Hawai‘i features the race for three seats up for grabs in the Office of Hawaiian Affairs Board of Trustees Races.

In the Moloka‘i contest, current Board Chair Colette Machado is facing challenger Luana Alapa, who edged out the veteran for the victory in the Primary Election. Since neither candidate drew more than 50 percent of the vote, both moved on to the General Election. Machado, a native of Moloka‘i and UH Mānoa graduate, was an activist in the movement to stop the military bombings of Kaho‘olawe. Political newcomer Alapa, also a graduate of UH Mānoa, is a former Miss Hawaii and entrepreneur who has opened her own modeling school and partnered with her sisters to open a clothing store and production company.

The race for the at-large seat features incumbent Keli‘i Akina against Keoni Souza. Akina holds advanced degrees from UH Mānoa and Northwestern University. He’s President and CEO of the Grassroot Institute of Hawaii, a public policy think tank. Souza has worked as a flight attendant, stevedore and Realtor, and is a musician with the Grammy-nominated Hawaiian music group Nā Hoa.

Keola Lindsey and Lanakila Mangauil are running for a Hawai‘i Island seat. Lindsey, a nephew of outgoing incumbent Robert Lindsey Jr. and a Waimea, Hawai‘i native, holds a master’s degree in public administration from UH Mānoa. He is currently OHA’s Advocacy Director. Mangauil is a former public school teacher who founded the Hawaiian Cultural Center of Hāmākua, where he is the Executive Director and lead instructor. Mangauil has been a vocal critic of the Thirty Meter Telescope (TMT) on Mauna Kea. Lindsey says he’s neutral on TMT.

The race for Senate District 16, which includes Pearl City, Waimalu, 'Aiea and Hālawā in Central O'ahu is a special election to fill the seat formerly held by Breene Harimoto, who died of cancer last June.

Running for the seat are Democrat Bennette Misalucha, who was appointed to the seat in July by Gov. David Ige and runs a strategic consulting company; and Republican Kelly Kitashima, a hotel executive who was raised in 'Aiea and is a former Mrs. Hawaii United States. In the race for Honolulu City Council 3 (Windward O'ahu), Esther Kia'āina and Greg Thielen are in a runoff for this seat formerly held by Ikaika Anderson. (Anderson resigned from the Council and took a job with a labor union.)

Kia'āina is a graduate of Kamehameha Schools, the University of Southern California and the George Washington University Law School. She worked in the U.S. Department of Interior and is the Executive Director of the Pacific Basin Development Council. Thielen, born and raised in Windward O'ahu, is a homebuilder and home remodeler, and has been named Building Industry Association-Hawaii Builder of the year. He is the son of longtime Windward O'ahu State lawmaker Cynthia Thielen, who is retiring.

State House District 30, in Honolulu's urban core, includes Kalihi Kai, Sand Island, Pearl Harbor and Hālawā Valley Estates. Upstart Democrat Ernesto Sonny Ganaden defeated incumbent Romy Cachola in the primary election. Ganaden is an attorney and youth program director who graduated from UCLA. His opponent is Republican Tess Abalos Quilingking, who lives in Kalihi and is a small business owner.

State Senate District 25 encompasses the eastern tip of Oʻahu, including the communities of Hawaii Kai, Portlock in East Honolulu and Waimānalo, Kailua, Enchanted Lake and Maunawili in Windward Oʻahu. This seat is open because Democrat Laura Thielen decided not to seek re-election.

Vying to replace Thielen are Democrat Chris Lee and Republican Kristina Kim-Marshall. Lee has represented part of the Windward Oʻahu portion of the district in the State House since 2008. He is a graduate of ʻIolani School and Oregon State University. Kim-Marshall grew up in East Honolulu and currently lives in Waimānalo. She is a graduate of the Shidler College of Business at the University of Hawaiʻi at Mānoa and is in the import/export business.

Three candidates are running for House District 5 on Hawai‘i Island, currently held by Richard Creagan who is not seeking re-election. The district represents Kailua-Kona, Kealahou, Ocean View and Nā‘ālehu.

Citlalli Johanna Decker is the Aloha ‘Āina Party candidate. She was born and raised in Texas and moved to Hawai‘i with her husband who is from Hawai‘i. Libertarian Party candidate Michael Last is an electrical engineering consultant who ran unsuccessfully in 2018 for the State Senate. Democratic Party candidate Jeanne Kapela was born in Kona and was raised on a coffee farm in Captain Cook.
