Section I. Issues.

The station has identified the following issues as significant issues facing our community in this quarter:

- A. **Autism Awareness**: Many families are dealing with autistic children and their challenges in Western Pennsylvania.
- B. **Animal Adoption**: There continues to be an abundance of animal neglect and abuse in our area.
- C. **Polk Center:** An area state facility which houses 200 residents with mental health issues, and employs 600 local people was announced that it is closing by 2022.
- D. **Christmas Toys for Needy Families:** Many low income families in our area are without money to buy toys for their kids for the holidays.

Section II. Responsive Programs/Programming

The station has broadcast programming dealing with each of the above-referenced issues. Programming dealing with each issue is set out below.

A. Autism Awareness:

We partnered with two local autism organizations, Autism Tough and Autism Stands. We promote a fund raising dodgeball tournament for Autism Stands and aired an awareness campaign for the Autism Tough organization.

B. **Animal Adoption**:

We promoted events at a local animal shelter and participated first-hand in volunteering to care for the animals at the shelter.

- C. **Polk Center**: The announcement of the closing of the center continues to be a hot-button issue within our community. We updated the public on efforts being made at the state legislative level by local county and local state officials. The result was a vote by the Pennsylvania State congress to extend closing of the facility until 2025.
- D. **Christmas Toys for Needy Families:**: We directly participated in a community effort by local businesses to collect toys for the local chapter of Toys For Tots, with weekly announcements of the drop off locations and live broadcasts over a five week period at the locations. The result was a total donation of over 3100 toys for kids at Christmas.
