CONTINUED ELIGIBILITY

Section (f) (2) (A) of the Community Broadcasters Protection Act ("CBPA") and Section 73.6001 of the Commission's rules set forth the continuing eligibility Requirements for Class A licensees.

To maintain its eligibility for Class A license, a Class A station must continue to broadcast 18 hours a day, and must broadcast an average of at least 3 hours per week of locally produced programming as defined in 47 C. F. R. 73.6000.

WBXI-CD Television meets each of the continuing eligibility requirements.

WBXI-CD broadcast 24 hours a day, 7 days a week during this time period – well over the 18 hours per day required.

July 1 through September 2, 2018:

Weekdays (23 hours Monday through Friday) WBXI presents DECADES: Television

Across The Decades, a nostalgic trip through classic television from the 1950s, 1960s, 1970s, and

1980s. This immersive viewer experience also features one-of-a-kind interstitial flashbacks to the

toys, fashion, events, headlines and nostalgia of each era. Fans of classic variety, sketch and talk

shows will also enjoy *The Best of The Ed Sullivan Show, Rowan and Martin's Laugh In* and *The Dick*Cavett Show presented each weekday, alongside our daily one-hour original series Through the

Decades, hosted by award-winning journalist Bill Kurtis.

Weekends (24 hours Saturday and Sunday) viewers are invited to tune-in for The Decades Weekend Binge, continuous episodes of television favorites.

September 3 through September 30, 2018:

Seven days a week WBXI presents StartTV. Start TV showcases strong and resourceful female leading characters in a lineup of contemporary and proven procedural dramas. Each lead character and series embody a boldness and determination to "Start" leading the way, seeking the truth, solving the crime and defending the innocent. Shows include Touched by an

Angel, Dr. Quinn, Medium, among others. On Sunday mornings StartTV airs three hours of Children's (E/I) programs.

Further, during 3rd quarter 2018 and WBXI-CD produced and aired 5 hours per week (one hour Monday through Friday) of locally produced weather information pertaining to Indianapolis and central Indiana. In addition, WBXI aired nine PSAs embedded in the Weather broadcast. Six were locally produced (Drug Free Marion County, Keep Indianapolis Beautiful, Its My City, and Indianapolis "Free Books") and all dealing with local issues and family concerns as shown in chart below:

In sum, at all relevant times covered by this memo, WBXI-CD Television has met the local produced programming requirements, and broadcast more than 18 hours per day. Accordingly, it continues to be eligible for Class A status.
