

HERE ARE THE FOURTH QUARTER STORIES FOR OCTOBER, NOVEMBER AND DECEMBER:

1. CENTER TOWNSHIP IN CLINTON COUNTY HAS BEEN NAMED AS THE TOP TOWNSHIP IN THE STATE OF INDIANA THIS YEAR.
2. THE KIRKLIN TOWN COUNCIL TERMINATED JOHN FAUCETT AS KIRKLIN TOWN MARSHAL EFFECTIVE IMMEDIATELY FOLLOWING THE CONCLUSION OF A DISCIPLINARY HEARING.
3. THE CLINTON COUNTY COMMISSIONERS APPROVED THE SCHEMATIC DESIGN PROPOSAL FROM AMERICAN STRUCTUREPOINT FOR THE NEW EMS BUILDING.
4. THE CLINTON COUNTY FAIR COUNCIL OFFICIALLY DEDICATED THE NEW ALL-WEATHER RACING TRACK AT THE CLINTON COUNTY FAIRGROUNDS IN HONOR OF JOHN 'DOC' McCLAIN.
5. FRANKFORT PARKS SUPERINTENDENT JOEL TATUM WAS FIRED FROM HIS POSITION DUE TO FINANCIAL VARIANCES WITHIN THE DEPARTMENT. STREET SUPERINTENDENT JASON FORSYTHE WAS NAMED INTERIM SUPERINTENDENT.
6. CAROL PRICE ANNOUNCES HER RETIRMENT FROM BOTH HEALTHY COMMUNITIES OF CLINTON COUNTY COALITION AND THE UNITED WAY IN NOVEMBER.
7. MAYOR CHRIS McBARNES NAMES FORMER PARKS SUPERINTENDENT TRAVIS SHEETS AS THE NEW FRANKFORT PARKS SUPERINTENDENT.
8. THE FRANKFORT CITY COUNCIL UNANIMOUSLY APPROVED A RESOLUTION WHICH WILL ALLOW THE NEW ELLIPSIS FRANKFORT MEDICAL OFFICE, LLC TO MOVE FORWARD WITH PLANS ON A NEW MEDICAL CENTER ACROSS THE STREET FROM WALMART.
9. APPROXIMATELY 75 TO 100 INDIVIDUALS, INCLUDING CITY AND COUNTY OFFICIALS, BRAVED THE CHILLY, WET CONDITIONS TO ATTEND THE DEDICATION OF ROY SCOTT PARKWAY.
10. THE FARMERS BANK HAS ANNOUNCED IT WILL EXPAND THE RETAIL BANKING HOURS AT THE MAIN OFFICE LCOATED AT 9 EAST CLINTON STREET IN FRANKFORT TO INCLUDE SATURDAY MORNINGS FROM 9 A.M. TO NOON BEGINNING NOVEMBER 4.
11. AFTER A FATAL CRASH INVESTIGATION, FRANKFORT POLICE HAVE ARRESTED 20-YEAR-OLD MAKAYLA WOOD OF FRANKFORT ON A WARRANT ISSUED BY CLINTON SUPERIOR COURT. THE CRASH RESULTED IN THE DEATH OF 69-YEAR-OLD KATHY CAMP OF FRANKFORT. TEN CHARGES WERE FILED AGAINST WOOD.

12. BACK IN MAY, THE FOREST FIRE STATION WAS DESTROYED BY AN EF-1 TORNADO. RECENTLY, THE TOWN RECEIVED WORD THEY WERE RECIPIENTS OF A \$500,000 GRANT FOR A NEW FIRE STATION IN THE CLINTON COUNTY COMMUNITY.
13. SEVERE STORMS ROLLED THROUGH FRANKFORT AND CLINTON COUNTY CAUSING SEVERE DAMAGE TO SEVERAL AREAS.
14. SIXTEEN COUNTY AND CITY OFFICIALS WENT ON A FACT FINDING BUS TOUR SPONSORED BY THE CLINTON COUNTY FAIR COUNCIL TO FACILITIES IN HENDRICKS AND BOONE COUNTIES.
15. DUE TO THE AMOUNT OF HEALTH INSURANCE CLAIMS THAT HAVE BEEN FILED THIS YEAR, THE FRANKFORT CITY COUNCIL IS GOING TO HAVE TO DEAL WITH A NEGATIVE BALANCE IN ONE OF ITS FUNDS.
16. CLINTON COUNTY RESIDENT GINA SHEETS HAS BEEN APPOINTED TO A POSITION WITHIN THE U.S. DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE BY PRESIDENT TRUMP.
17. THE SEVERE STORMS THAT HIT FRANKFORT HIGH SCHOOL ON NOVEMBER 18 CAUSED AN UNDETERMINED AMOUNT OF DAMAGE TO FRANKFORT HIGH SCHOOL.
18. FRANKFORT HIGH SCHOOL WON ITS 1,500TH BASKETBALL GAME IN SCHOOL HISTORY BY DEFEATING BENTON CENTRAL 45-37 IN THE SEVENTH-PLACE GAME OF THE FRANCISCAN HEALTH HOOPS CLASSIC DECEMBER 2 IN LAFAYETTE. IN ADDITION TO THE 1,500 VICTORIES, FRANKFORT ALSO HAS FOUR STATE CHAMPIONSHIPS TO ITS CREDIT.
19. CLINTON COUNTY HIGHWAY SUPERINTENDENT KEVIN MYERS HAS BEEN NAMED PRESIDENT OF THE INDIANA ASSOCIATION OF COUNTY HIGHWAY ENGINEERS AND SUPERVISORS FOR 2018.
20. IT APPEARS AS THOUGH THE CLINTON COUNTY COURTHOUSE IS GOING TO BE OPEN EVERY DAY OF THE WEEK FOR A FULL DAY.
