

1. THE UTILITY SERVICE BOARD APPROVED ASSISTANT CITY, LIGHT AND POWER SUPERINTENDENT MIKE MYERS AS THE NEW CITY, LIGHT AND POWER SUPERINTENDENT. MYERS REPLACES STEVE MILLER, WHO RETIRED LATE LAST YEAR BEFORE TAKING A SIMILAR POSITION WITH THE UTILITY COMPANY IN RENSSALAER.
2. ANOTHER RESTAURANT IS COMING TO DOWNTOWN FRANKFORT AS JOHN VIRTUE, WHO ALSO OWNS PEPE'S AND JOHNNY V'S MAIN STREET GRILLE AND SPORTS PUB, PLANS TO OPEN GREEK'S PIZZERIA IN THE BUILDING THAT FORMERLY HOUSED JACK & JILL'S CHILDREN'S SHOPPE AT 5 NORTH JACKSON STREET.
3. STEVE BEARDSLEY WAS NAMED TO THE FRANKFORT CITY COUNCIL FOLLOWING A CAUCUS MEETING OF THE REPUBLICAN PARTY AT OLD STONEY. HE REPLACES TODD CORRIE, WHO LEFT TO BECOME THE GENERAL MANAGER OF THE UTILITY SERVICE BOARD.
4. THE CITY OF FRANKFORT WILL BE LOSING ONE OF ITS GROCERY STORES AS MARSH ANNOUNCED IT WAS CLOSING ITS STORE HERE LOCALLY. THE LAST DAY IS SCHEDULED TO BE MAY 14.
5. A THIRD INDIVIDUAL HAS ANNOUNCED HIS CANDIDACY FOR THE SOON-TO-BE-VACANT CLINTON COUNTY SHERIFF'S POSITION AS LIEUTENANT JERRAD BLACKER OF THE SHERIFF'S OFFICE ANNOUNCED HIS INTENTIONS TO RUN. HE JOINS FORMER TWO-TIME SHERIFF MARK MITCHELL AND RICH KELLY OF THE INDIANA STATE POLICE AS THOSE RUNNING TO PLACE CURRENT AND TWO-TERM SHERIFF JEFF WARD.
6. DEMOLITION ON THE TWO DOWNTOWN BUILDINGS WHICH USED TO HOUSE BOTH CREEKSIDE AND MARIA'S ON EAST CLINTON STREET ACROSS FROM OLD STONEY IS NOW COMPLETE. THIS WAS THE FINAL STEP BEFORE CLEANUP BEGINS AND THE INSTALLATION FOR ADDITIONAL PARKING THE LOT WHICH IS OWNED BY THE COUNTY FOLLOWING A SWAP WITH THE CITY IN EXCHANGE FOR SEVEN HOLES ON THE FRANKFORT COMMONS GOLF COURSE LAST YEAR.
7. FRANKFORT POLICE HAVE PARTNERED WITH NIXLE TO IMPLEMENT THE COMPANY'S COMMUNICATION NOTIFICATION SYSTEM TO ALERT RESIDENTS IN REAL TIME ABOUT LOCALIZED EMERGENCY SITUATIONS AND RELEVANT COMMUNITY ADVISORIES.
8. THE FOREST FIRE STATION SUSTAINS HEAVY DAMAGE FROM AN EF-1 TORNADO WITH WIND SPEEDS AS HIGH AS 95 MILES AN HOUR HIT THE TOWN MAY 20.

9. THE CLINTON COUNTY COMMISSIONERS HEARD A REPORT FROM AMERICAN STRUCTUREPOINT ON WHAT IT WOULD COST TO FIX ALL THE PROBLEMS IN THE CLINTON COUNTY COURTHOUSE.
10. CLINTON PRAIRIE IS THE FIRST CHAMPION IN A STATEWIDE ELECTRIC GO-CART COMPETITION SPONSORED BY PURDUE UNIVERSITY.
11. INDOT BEGINS MILLING AND RENOVATION WORK ON WALNUT STREET FROM JACKSON TO HOKE TO HELP STATE ROAD 28 LAST UNTIL THE MAJOR ROAD RENOVATION HAPPENS IN 2019.
12. FIREFIGHTERS FROM FRANKFORT, ROSSVILLE AND MULBERRY BATTLE A FIRE FOR ABOUT FOUR HOURS OVERNIGHT AT THE CLINTON COUNTY LANDFILL.
13. AFTER OFFICIALLY ACQUIRING THE FRANKFORT HOSPITAL SITE TWO WEEKS EARLIER, INDIANA UNIVERSITY HEALTH OFFICIALS HELD A DEDICATION CEREMONY AND OFFICALLY NAMED THE FACILITY INDIANA UNIVERSITY HEALTH FRANKFORT HOSPITAL.
14. THE BOARD OF WORKS APPROVES A RECOMMENDATION BY FRANKFORT POLICE CHIEF TROY BACON THAT FRANKFORT POLICE OFFICER WESLEY HICKSON ON ADMINISTRATIVE LEAVE WITHOUT PAY. HICKSON IS FACING THREE DIFFERENT CRIMINAL CHARGES THAT ALLEGEDLY HAPPENED IN MIAMI COUNTY ON MAY 27.
15. THE CLINTON PRAIRIE SCHOOL BOARD HOLDS ITS FIRST MEETING IN ITS NEW ADMINISTRATION BUILDING ON THE CLINTON PRAIRIE CAMPUS AND TAKES STEPS ON HOW TO DEAL WITH THE OLD ADMINISTRATION BUILDING IN JEFFERSON.
16. THREE DAYS AFTER BEING REINSTATED AS WATER SUPERINTENDENT, JOHN SOLENBERG SUBMITTED HIS RESIGNATION AND REACHED AN AGREEMENT WITH THE UTILITY SERVICE BOARD ON A FINAL PAYOUT.
17. THE CLINTON COUNTY BOARD OF ZONING APPEALS HAS APPROVED LOCATIONS FOR WILSON TRAILERS AND PERFORMANCE AG, PAVING THE WAY FOR BOTH BUSINESSES TO LOCATE IN CLINTON COUNTY JUST NORTH OF M&K TRUCKING ON 800 WEST NEAR THE INTERSECTION OF INDIANA 28 WEST AND INTERSTATE 65.
18. THE IRONBLOCK BUILDING IN DOWNTOWN FRANKFORT WHICH CURRENTLY HOUSES BOTH THE CLINTON COUNTY CHAMBER OF COMMERCE AND FRANKFORT MAIN STREET IS ABOUT TO UNDERGO A RENAISSANCE OF SORTS IN THE NEXT FOUR MONTHS.

19. THE JONSON FOUNTAIN, SCULPTED IN THE 1920s BY JON MAGNUS JONSON, IS OFFICIALLY REDEDICATED AT OLD STONEY AFTER BEING AT TPA PARK FOR MORE THAN EIGHT DECADES.

20. THE FRANKFORT ADULT LEARNING CENTER IS CLOSING AFTER 25 YEARS OF PROVIDING EXCEPTIONAL EDUCATION FOR THOSE WHO WERE IN NEED.
