Section A: Newscast Overview and Quarterly Issues Addressed

WRBN Radio produces daily newscasts that air on a regularly scheduled basis. A one-minute news tease is aired at the bottom of the hour Monday through Friday between 6am and 9am. On WRBN, just after ABC news at the top of the hour between 6am and 9am Monday through Friday, WRBN airs a 3-minute live newscast. A two-minute recorded newscast airs at 12pm and at 4pm, 5pm, and 6pm Monday through Friday on WRBN. These are two-minutes in length. WRBN reports local and area news events and issues on an ongoing basis.

News Treatments: The nominal length of each of our lead or feature news stories described below is between 30-seconds and one minute. One to two versions of each story aired multiple times during a 12-hour news cycle and are posted online.

Some of the issues covered in these newscasts and programs during the quarter are as

follows. Dates indicate local news treatment unless otherwise noted.

1 -Monday is the Voter Registration Deadline

Monday, October 5, 2020, is the final day to register to vote and be eligible to cast a ballot in the November General Election. It's fairly simple to register to vote through the Secretary of State's Office website at www.registertovote.sos.ga.gov. To register online, you must have a valid Georgia Driver's License or ID card issued by the Georgia Department of Driver Services. If you don't have either of these things, you can pick up a mail-in form, from the local Registrar's Office. To be eligible to vote in Georgia, you must be a U.S. citizen, a legal resident of whichever county you live in, and at least 18 years old on Election Day. In addition, you cannot be serving a sentence "for conviction of a felony involving moral turpitude," and you cannot have been found "mentally incompetent" by a judge. If you are registered to vote or think you are, it's important to check your voter registration status before October 5. Georgia has a "use it or lose it" law and in January, the state removed thousands of inactive voters, those who had not voted in eight years, from state voter rolls. 2 - Search for Clayton City Manager going Well

Several interested people have submitted resumes to be the next Clayton City Manager, says Clayton Mayor Jordan Green. "The search for a city manager is going very well. I've turned a lot of that responsibility to Mia Sharpton. I did receive a few resumes and turned those over to her. She is going to collect all of them through what we said is the end date for the application process, which is November 6. From there the Council will review the applications and our plan is to pick the top five to six of what we consider to be the best applicants and then set up interviews. So, that process is actually going very well. We do have a lot of interested people and we have a lot of highly motivated and qualified candidates that have sent in resumes." The City Manager is the chief administrative officer responsible for the City's daily operation and oversight of all departments. The City Manager reports directly to the Clayton City Council.

3 -Rabun County Schools closed October 29, 2020

Rabun County Schools will be closed on Thursday, Oct. 29, 2020, due to inclement weather. This will not be a remote learning day due to the potential internet and power outages across the area. All after school activities for Thursday are cancelled. Twelve-month employees should plan to report at 10am if it is safe to do so. Check with your supervisor for an update after 9am in the morning.

4 - Eleven Deaths due to COVID-19 in Rabun County

The Georgia Department of Public Health is reporting 11 deaths in Rabun County due to complications of COVID-19. The latest report has Rabun County with 437 positive cases of coronavirus. In other neighboring counties, Habersham County lists 78 deaths and 1,909 cases of the virus, White County reports 24 fatalities and 1,022 cases, and Towns County has had 13 deaths and 455 cases of the respiratory virus. Across the state of Georgia, the Department of Public Health is now reporting a total of 361,982 cases, of those, 31,720 have been hospitalized and 7,981 have died from complications of the virus.

5 - Identity Scam reported in Mountain City

An identity scam is under investigation by the Rabun County Sheriff's Office. On Nov. 16, a Mountain City woman spoke with a deputy about a suspicious call she received from a Hispanic male claiming to be with the Social Security Office. The caller asked her to verify the last four digits of her Social Security number and then hung up the phone. She tried calling the number back but received a message saying that it was not a working number.

6 - Graduation Rate increases in Rabun County Schools

Congratulations to the Rabun County High School Class of 2020 for increasing the graduation rate. Rabun County Schools Superintendent Dr. April Childers is proud of the students and teachers for this tremendous accomplishment. "We just received our numbers a few days ago from the Georgia Department of Education and our graduation rate for the 2020 Class is 92.9 percent, that's a .7 percent increase over 2019. As we celebrate that, we celebrate it PreK-12 because graduation is not a high school event, it's an education event. Our teachers work hard to instill quality learning and success from the day they enter in PreK. So, a shout out to all of our teachers a time to celebrate that achievement for all of them." Overall, Georgia's graduation rate increased in 2020, rising to 83.8 percent, which is an all-time high since the state began using the adjusted cohort calculation now required by federal law, and up from 82 percent in

2019. In 2020, 105 Georgia school districts and 230 schools recorded graduation rates at or above 90 percent.

7 - Camp Creek Structure Fire

Rabun County Fire Services responded at 10:32am on Tuesday, Dec. 1, 2020, to a report of a structure fire at 1359 Camp Creek Road. Dispatch advised that all occupants were out. Station's 4, 7, and 12 responded. Engine 4 arrived to a two-story multifamily dwelling on a basement with fire through the basement entry door and garage door. Fire was spreading rapidly up into the

apartment above the basement. Initial attack was through the basement and then was moved to the main floor. The fire was brought under control in approximately 20 minutes. One apartment sustained heavy fire damage with fire breaching the floor. Another sustained fire and water damage and the end apartment sustained smoke damage. The finished attic, accessible only from the outside sustained smoke damage. Red Cross and the State Fire Marshal were notified. The cause of the fire is currently under investigation by the State Fire Marshal's Office. One occupant was assessed by Rabun EMS and refused transport. Fire personnel were on scene until 1:42pm.

Randy Hughes, Toys for Tots Coordinator for Macon, Jackson, Swain, Haywood, and Rabun counties tells how you can help. "We picked up most of our collection boxes yesterday hoping we would have enough toys and everything but we still have about 400 kids left to help that we don't have toys for right now. So, I will be out at the Clayton Walmart today collecting until about 4:30pm trying to get enough toys in to make sure that we have toys or money donations so we can buy the toys. We have about a 25% reduction in our collection sites this year and an almost 30% increase in the number of kids needing toys this year. So, we just need some help from the public."
