"There's some uncertainty with that right now, I mean the Constitution is not clear on this, and I've looked at it a little bit. It appears Governor Quinn, at least for now, can appoint someone to that position," Illinois Senator Darin LaHood (R-37) said. But when Governor-Elect Bruce Rauner takes office in mid-January, Republicans said he will have the ability to make a new appointment for the next term. But the state's election code says an appointment lasts until a new officer is 'elected and qualified.' That rule could mean Quinn's appointee could serve until the 2018 election.	and 2002.
