Two Cobb County school board members were questioned by a grand jury about problems with the way the school board operates. The members stayed tight lipped about what was covered in the grand jury investigation.
- 4/7/11 5 :50
A group of lawmakers says the Atlanta School Board is making progress to avoid losing its accreditation. They say the mayor and governor need to allow the current school board members to do their job and not threaten to take over the school system or remove board members.
- 4/7/11 6,10 :40
There was a huge celebration on the Spelman College campus to celebrate the school's 130th birthday. The Founders Day celebration included a procession across campus by the senior class and a convocation ceremony that dates back to 1896.
- 4/13/11 5,6,10 2:00
Cobb County school board members have less than two weeks to respond to information requested by the southern association of colleges and schools. After several complaints from frustrated parents, sacs wants details about how the governing body operates.
- 4/17/11 10 :30
82 students were awarded one thousand dollar scholarships. Students from Georgia, Tennessee, and the Carolinas were selected based on their outstanding academic performance and community service.

Clayton County school board members are deciding how they're going to make up a \$49 million budget shortfall over the next two years. They have to cut programs.
- 4/19/11 5,6,10,11 2:30
The Georgia Board of Regents voted to raise tuition. Georgia students will now have to pay up to \$450 more a semester starting in the fall. The board says the increase will help compensate for a massive budget shortfall.
- 4/19/11 5 :30
Thousands of Georgians will have to pay more to earn their GED. Students will pay up to \$250 for the five part test. That's up from \$95.

Several Atlanta school employees were questioned regarding a CRCT cheating scandal. State investigators interviewed employees about the high number of erasures on the standardized tests.

Hundreds of parents are upset over a school redistricting plan. The plan could send more than 700 students to different schools next year.

Governor Nathan Deal signs off on a bill that will allow him to remove Atlanta school board members. Several of the district's schools are currently under investigation for alleged cheating on the CRCT tests.

Hundreds of Gwinnett County students will be going to new schools in the fall. The school board voted yes to a new redistricting plan that will shake up attendance, despite emotional opposition from some parents.

Comedian Bill Cosby took part in events honoring Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. on the 43rd anniversary of King's death. Cosby served as the master of ceremonies for the Southern Christian Leadership Conference's inaugural "Dream Keeper" awards prayer breakfast. Cosby told the audience he came to the conference because of the SCLC's willingness to help young people in need.

On the 43rd anniversary of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr's assassination, his children gathered to remember him. MLK III joined a workers rights rally at the state capitol in honor of a cause his father died defending.

Seven illegal immigrants were arrested during a sit-in at Georgia State University. Police arrested them after they sat in the middle of a downtown street.

The Reverend Joseph Lowery spoke at an Atlanta church about his new book, "Singing the Lord's Song in a Strange Land." He hopes it inspires the next generation to strive for racial equality.
- 4/11/11 5 2:30
The Georgia Historical Society is putting up markers around the state to mark the 150th anniversary of the civil war. But one marker in particular is causing controversy with the NAACP.
- 4/11/11 GDA 3:00
Live guest segment. The head of the Atlanta NAACP is now happy with a decision by the Georgia Historical Society to put up a Civil War marker on the burning of Atlanta along MLK drive. Dr. RL White says the Civil War holds negative feelings for many African Americans. But Dr. Todd Groce, GHS President, says the 13 new markers going up across the state all pay tribute to African Americans and women who made contributions to the Civil War.

A Georgia mother fears she will be deported and separated from her children because she is an illegal immigrant. Her family is speaking publicly about their plight and they're getting help from a civil rights group.

About 1,000 people gathered outside the state capitol for a May Day immigration rally. Protesters are calling on Governor Nathan Deal to veto a bill that cracks down on illegal immigration. They're concerned the bill compromises worker's rights and promotes racial profiling.

The controversial Florida pastor who burned a Koran is back in the news. Pastor Terry Jones was just arrested for a planning an unlawful protest outside the largest mosque in the United States. Newsedge anchor Tom Haynes traveled to Gainesville to interview the pastor.

It's been 50 years since one of the milestones of the civil rights movement: the historic freedom riders bus ride. Two buses carrying 13 freedom riders embarked on a journey through the South protesting segregation. Georgia Congressman John Lewis was among the freedom riders attacked when they tried to enter a whites-only area in South Carolina. Students will retrace the freedom rides as part of a new documentary.

A Henry County man says his faith got him kicked out of a courtroom. The man claims the judge ordered him out of court because he would not remove his Muslim headdress.

Musician Carlos Santana told Atlanta Braves fans, shame on Georgians, for the new immigration law just signed by the Governor. Santana was honored along with others during a ceremony before the game. Santana later told reporters the law was no better than the KKK.

About 100 Cobb County students walked out of class to protest Georgia's new immigration law. The students, many of them undocumented, gathered in front of Pebblebrook High School.
