## THE CORROSION OF CONSERVATISM

**PART 1:** When Donald Trump announced his presidential bid in 2015, conservative historian Max Boot couldn't help but think he was watching a dystopian science-fiction movie. He couldn't fathom that the party of Lincoln, Roosevelt and Reagan could endorse a reality TV star with no prior political experience and a laundry list of controversies.

This created an ideological dislocation so shattering that Boot's transformation from Republican foreign policy adviser to celebrated anti-Trump columnist is the dramatic story of his new book, The Corrosion of Conservatism.

After joining other prominent conservatives such as David Frum, Rick Wilson and Ana Navarro in denouncing Trump's candidacy and subsequent presidency, Boot left the Republican Party. No longer a Republican, but also not a Democrat, Boot's journey from a movement conservative to a man without a party is one worth hearing about. While 90 percent of his fellow Republicans endorsed President Trump's agenda in the aftermath of the 2016 election, Boot stood his ground, enduring the criticism of conservative colleagues.

**PART 2:** Rick Wilson is a seasoned Republican political strategist and self-proclaimed infamous negative ad maker. His regular column with The Daily Beast is a must-read in the political community, and he's widely published in The Washington Post, Politico and The Hill. In Everything Trump Touches Dies, Wilson brings his dark humor and biting analysis to what he calls the "absurdity of American politics in the Age of Trump." Come hear this lifelong conservative's views of a Republican Party that he says "has abandoned its principles" and what that bodes for the future of the country.

In 2014, Mother Jones journalist Shane Bauer made national headlines when he went not-so- undercover as a guard at Winn Correctional Center, a private prison in Louisiana. He used his real name, and due to lack of any real background checks, remained employed for four months. In that short time, Bauer witnessed firsthand the horrific conditions both prisoners and guards faced at the hands of the billion-dollar private prison industry and wrote an exposé that became Mother Jones' most read piece of all time. He argues that the private prison system is rarely held accountable for the atrocities that happen quietly within its concrete walls.

As President Trump enters his third year in office, former New Jersey governor Chris Christie remains one of his closest political allies. The first major elected official to endorse then-candidate Trump, Christie had a ringside seat throughout the hectic 2016 campaign. Christie was even close to becoming Trump's running mate. Days after Trump's surprise victory, Trump fired Christie as head of his transition team. Recently, Christie almost became Trump's White House chief of staff but pulled out, saying now is not the right time for him to join the White House.

Now Christie is out to set the record straight about his career and his relationship with the president. And, for the first time, Christie tells the full story of his own Kushner saga: how, as a federal prosecutor, he put Jared Kushner's powerful father behind bars for tax evasion, witness tampering and illegal campaign contributions.

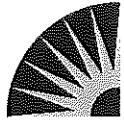
