The Las Vegas Coalition for Zero Fatalities is providing up to \$20,000 in free Lyft ride credits for Fourth of July revelers. New and existing users can receive \$5 off two rides to and from their destination with the code “SMART4TH” on July 4 and 5, while supplies last. “Over 300,000 travelers from across the world visited Las Vegas for Independence Day in 2018 and we expect a record level of visitors this year,” said Drena Kusari, general manager for Lyft’s southwest region. “By riding smart, passengers have the freedom to watch fireworks or a parade, enjoy a BBQ or pool party without the hassle of dealing with traffic and looking for a parking spot.”

The initiative is part of the Las Vegas Coalition for Zero Fatalities’ continued efforts to eliminate impaired driving by providing up to \$200,000 in free Lyft credits on typically high volume alcohol consumption holidays in 2019. Additionally, the Regional Transportation of Southern Nevada’s Trip to Strip on-demand ride-hailing service is offering 15 percent off to new riders.

Young people between 14 and 26 years old, who are currently or were previously in foster care in any state, are eligible for time-limited COVID-19 pandemic relief funds. The federal Consolidated Appropriation Act was signed into law on December 27, 2020 and provides additional funds and flexibilities for young people living in Nevada. The State has been awarded about \$4 million in John H. Chafee Foster Care Program funds to be distributed to individuals throughout the state. The Nevada Division of Child and

Family Services is encouraging former foster youth to contact the child welfare representative in their area to see if they are eligible for the COVID-19 pandemic relief funds or the opportunity to re-enter foster care. Youth who left foster care between January 27, 2020, and April 20, 2021, may be eligible to re-enter foster care. For eligible young people who do not wish to re-enter foster care, financial assistance may be available. Some of the assistance that former foster care youth may receive are funds to cover basic needs, rent, utilities, food, childcare, transportation, access to technology, and education/employment support.

More than 47% of Nevadans currently eligible for the vaccine are fully vaccinated, and 57% of the eligible population has initiated vaccinations. Clark County reports that more than 46% of its eligible residents are fully vaccinated, edging closer to its goal of 60%. For those who remain unvaccinated, COVID-19 is largely inevitable. Dr. Shadaba Asad is an infectious disease specialist working with University Medical Center and the VA Southern Nevada Healthcare System.

She said the situation regarding COVID-19 patients at UMC is much more manageable. The numbers are significantly lower than in early July, which is when the cases peaked. She said she thinks that every time there is a surge of cases, more people get vaccinated.

She believes mandates are needed, but doesn't know when we might see an impact on the numbers. For Las Vegas, there is no magic number known for herd immunity and she added the longer it takes to reach herd immunity, the more time the virus has to come up with variants that are easily transmissible, and some of them in the future might “escape our current vaccines.” Dr. Asad said about 95% of those COVID-19 cases in the hospital were not vaccinated. A majority realized they could have had the vaccine and not end up in the hospital and do so once their infection clears up, she said.

Rooted in Community! House of Vegas Pride is a large three-day Summer multicultural festival in Las Vegas. Shawn, Bojo and Nudia get together for LV Unity to discuss the memorial design for 1 October. The 1 October Memorial Committee during its most recent meeting revealed results from a survey that was conducted from March 15 through August 2, 2021. The online questionnaire garnered 5,199 responses, with roughly 5,000 submissions answering all or most of the questions. The committee relayed that the respondents want the memorial site to focus on eight key emotions: remembrance, respect, healing, honor, unity, community, peace, and love. And those feelings, the survey says, shouldn't be interfered with by politics. Nearly all of those polled said topics that have become severely politicized, one relevant example being gun control, should be avoided. However, 73 percent answered that education was very or somewhat important. The 1 October Memorial Committee is responsible for the overall planning for what will be a permanent tribute site on the Las Vegas Strip remembering the horrific October 1, 2017, mass shooting. Nearly four years ago, gunman Stephen Paddock assembled an arsenal of high-caliber weapons in his 32nd-floor Mandalay Bay suite. He opened fire on a packed crowd below attending the outdoor Route 91 Harvest country music festival.

Paddock's firing spree lasted 10 minutes. Paddock killed himself as law enforcement approached. MGM Resorts, the operator of Mandalay Bay and owner of the Las Vegas Village site where the massacre occurred, is donating part of the land for the memorial.

Successful transplantation is often enhanced by the matching of organs between members of the same ethnic and racial group.

Southern Nevada’s food aficionados and culinary community came together in a big way to support Las Vegas Restaurant Week this year. Orianne Collins is a successful entrepreneur, professional speaker, jewelry designer, philanthropist and mother of three boys, two with music legend Phil Collins. Born and raised in Nyon, Switzerland, she obtained her master's degree in International Management and started her career as the marketing and communication manager for a capital venture company before opening her own events and communications company, O-Com SA, in 1994. As a 3rd Dan black belt in mixed martial arts, she was participating in a martial arts exhibition in Paris against Jesse Glover, Bruce Lee's first student in 2014, when she suffered a neck injury. After a seemingly straightforward operation, she woke up paralyzed from the neck down due to a medical error.
