Issue: Weather

Date: 7/28/23 Time of day: 4:03pm

**Duration: 1 minute** 

Brief description of programming: Our listeners were informed of a Urgent Weather Message from the National Weather Service in Birmingham, concerning a Heat Advisory in effect in our county and adjoining counties in our listening area. Our listeners were given information about the impacts the severe heat can cause and were given information on precautionary and preparedness actions.

Issue: Blood Drive

Brief description of programming: Information was given to our listeners concerning a Blood Drive being held in our community. On July 31st from 2-6, at the Centre First Methodist Church in Centre. There is an urgent need to blood donations for out area.

Issue: Safety

Brief description of programming: Information concerning a new law prohibiting use of or holding a cell phone while driving was passed along to our listeners. The bill was signed by Governor Kay Ivey on June 23rd and went into effect immediately. For the first 12 months, law enforcement officers can only write a warning for this infraction, after the first 12 months. Details about what will happen after the 12 month period was given to our listeners.

Brief description of programming: Our local community college has been selected for a study funded by the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation and conducted by researchers with Macmillan Learning, the publisher of textbooks and learning resources for colleges and universities. According to Susan King, Biology instructor at Gadsden State Community College, they are very excited to be a part of this study that will help instructors in developing methods and techniques that help students learn better. King stated that students can be a part of the study voluntarily and can earn multiple gift cards for their feedback and participation. Classes start on August 21st.
