In addition to the regular weekly news talk program, Friday afternoons now include a statewide edition of The Florida Roundup.

The Florida Roundup: Statewide Edition

This program, newly launched in Oct., mirrors the format of WLRN's original Florida Roundup program with a broader statewide focus. Each week WLRN's <u>Tom Hudson</u> is joined by WJCT's <u>Melissa Ross</u>, and a panel of journalists from around the state, to discuss the week in Florida news. The program airs live Fridays at 1 pm and in addition to WLRN in South Florida and WJCT in Jacksonville, also is carried on WGCU-Fort Myers, WQCS-Fort Pierce, WFIT-Melbourne and WUFT-Gainesville.
