**ISSUE:
MARIJUANA/IMPACT IN THE COMMUNITY**

Pot Intoxication Death

Program: 5 PM Evening News

When: April 2, 2014

Description of Program:

The medical forensic office revealed today, Wednesday, that the primary reason why Levy Thamba of 19 years fell from the second floor of the Holiday Inn in Stapleton, was because of an over dosage of marijuana. This young man was studying in Wyoming and was a native of the Congo Republic. He ingested an edible cookie of marijuana and since he was not familiar with the effects of the drug, he fell from the balcony of his bedroom losing his life hours after. A death that leaves the community concerned, according to a resident of Denver. At the time of his death, Thamba had a concentration of marijuana of 7.2 nanograms of THC in his blood. The state limit that determines a person is not capable of driving is of 5 nanograms.

Marijuana Money

Description of Program:

The projection in the marijuana industry is very strong this year and our construction has been generating a lot of jobs and growth in the city which will bring us more money that can be spent and invested in other activities. This year, about 40,000 homes are predicted to be constructed. The demand for homes to either buy or rent is going up in the state of Colorado. LICENSE FOR UNDOCUMENTED**

Drivers License Update PKG

When: April 28, 2014

Description of Program:

This is a reality that would change the lives of many undocumented immigrants. The requirements for obtaining a drivers license are: valid identity papers from your country of origin, demonstrate that you have lived in Colorado for at least two continuous years and documents of your payments to state and federal taxes. The exam will be in English; therefore people will be able to take an interpreter to help translate. Let's take into account that the licenses will be identity documents but will not be considered as legal residency documents in the United States therefore the license cannot be used to board airplanes or request public benefits.

License for Undocumented

Description of Program:

Just two months before the entry of the law known as licenses for all, the number of offices where people will be able to make their appointments and request it could result in complications for many Colorado residents. That is because only 5 of the 37 offices of the department of motor vehicles will be granting the licenses. Barbara Brohl, executive director of the department of motor vehicles, DMV by its acronym in English, explains why they decided to transact the licenses in a reduced number of offices. Barbara said "We want to make sure that we are developing this program efficiently and carefully and that our employees, who will be serving this portion of the population, are well prepared."

LOCAL CRIME**

Raped by Family

Description of Program:

After being sexually abused by six brothers during ten years, the now adolescent, raised her voice and reports the repugnant abuses to the authorities of protection services to minors of Colorado Springs. Originating from North Carolina, the brothers Jackson between the ages of 18 and 27, like their parents John and Nita Jackson, face charges of violation of a minor, sexual abuse and child abuse. The parents of the minors knew what was happening and never reported it. The investigation of the case started a little over a year in the county Perquimans in North Carolina. It was then that the family described by its neighbors as “rare” moved to Colorado. Rosa Vergil from the organization “Fresh Start” explains why in many of these cases the parents are also guilty as the attackers by not reporting such a serious crime as a violation.

Robberies in Greenwood Village

Description of Program:

A wave of home thefts has been unleashed in the last days in Greenwood Village. This has residents under alert in this residential zone, which is considered quite safe, as these types of crimes are very rare. According to the police department at least four houses were raided between March 31 and April 7th. The thefts took place during the day and the first hours of the afternoon. The suspects enter the homes forcing the doors and the stolen objects include small electronic devices which are easy to carry, jewelry, and other household items. Police believe that all these thefts are related.

End Quotas for Beds in Detention Centers

Description of Program:

According to statistics published by the “Detention Watch Network” the service of immigration and customs control, holds a minimum of 34 thousand immigrants per day. Many of them in private detention centers like the one located in Aurora. Centers that charge a fee for a bed of at least 122 dollars per day money that comes from the pockets of the taxpayers. This afternoon, dozens of pro immigrants and community leaders marched towards the offices of the center of detention GEO in Aurora asking for an end to the so called Quota for a Bed.

ACLU on Immigration Detainers

Description of Program:

The sheriff of the county of Denver, Gary Wilson, announced today that this city will unite to the growing areas of Colorado that have decided in the last two days, to reject the claims of ICE of stopping residents without criminal orders or legal justification. “The majority of people will not have contact with ICE for cases at local levels, in the past between four and six thousand people were deported every year in Colorado for just coming in contact with local police.” Some of the counties that will change such politics are Boulder, Mesa, Routt, Jefferson, Grand, the county of San Miguel and Denver.

The Colorado Kinder System

Description of Program:

In its first year, the program “The Colorado System” has transformed the lives of Hispanic students from the schools Garden Place and Swansea Elementary in Denver. This free musical program provides instruments and musical instruction to students of low resources that do not have the opportunity to demonstrate their music talents. The program “The Colorado System” is offering several free music camps during the summer to students from first grade to twelve grades.

DPS “Teacher in Home” Program

Description of Program:

The free English program “MATT or Teacher in Home” helped more than 677 parents graduate with a certificate that verifies their basic knowledge of English, during 2013. According to promoters, this is a practical and indispensable English course for parents of Hispanic origin. A certificate with a very particular objective, after finishing the term of 36 weeks of learning at home students have the opportunity of taking an exam that will benefit them in various aspects. This year, public schools of Denver and the program “Teacher in Home” granted more than 5000 free English courses and invite all participants to take the exam.

Flood Concerns

Description of Program:

The rainy season in our state has begun. Along with it comes great concern for residents of the village of Lyons, which was heavily affected by historic floods from the past September. More than 50 families have asked the government to buy their homes so that they can leave Lyons forever. If a severe storm would be present, the growth of the river St. Vrain would once again devastate at least 2000 residents in Lyons. According to authorities of the city, if this would happen, residents would have a notice to prepare and evacuate their homes in a period of 20 minutes. After the heavy rains and floods from September, the ground was left extremely saturated from the water and is very prone to a landslide. At the moment, residents are relying on the sand bags to protect them in case of unexpected storms.

Mudslide Update

Description of Program:

A mudslide in the county of Mesa left three men missing. Rescuers search for the missing persons possibly driven by a huge mudslide that happened on Sunday afternoon in our state. According to authorities the three men have been identified, Clancy Nichols of 51 years, his son Danny Nichols of 24 years and Wes Hawkins of 46 years who disappeared close to Collbran. Torrential rains in the area during the weekend probably contributed to the cause of the mudslide, according to authorities. The authorities described the area as unstable and estimate that an entire mountain will be sliding during most of the day.

Hunger Free Colorado

Description of Program:

The summer vacations tend to be filled with joy for many children because they can enjoy long days playing outdoors either in a park or in their house. Unfortunately for many of the young ones in our area, their greatest concern is knowing where they will be having their next break feast or lunch when schools are closed during the summer months. Michelle Ray from Hunger Free Colorado said, "Hunger is a major problem in Colorado, and our state actually has one of the fastest growing rates of child poverty, and it is estimated that about 1 of every 5 children have experienced hunger." This is why organizations in Colorado make free summer meal programs across the state with the purpose of children having what to eat during that time.

First Lady on School Lunches

Description of Program:

What millions of children have for break feast in public schools of the country has turned into the center of a political battle. Gathered with nutritionists from school districts of different states, the first lady Michelle Obama criticized a proposal in the congress, to soften a requirement of schools serving nutritious meals to their students. Michelle Obama said," The last thing we can do now is to play politics with the health of our children." A law that was approved in Congress in 2010 forces schools to serve more fruits and vegetables and whole grains and limit the meals with a lot of salt, oil, and sugar.

Beer Ban in Public Parks

Description of Program:

The proposal of law that seeks to prohibit drinking beer in Washington Park in Denver is being debated. This proposal seeks according to some councilors; avoid what is being done every day. Streets that transform into public urinals and people who leave waste such as bottles and cans of beer and garbage in different areas of the park. According to the office of parks and recreations of Denver, in the last year they have given 12 thousand warning notifications to people who have broken the law. Only beers with a 3.2 percentage of alcohol are allowed to be consumed in the parks. A regular beer in a liquor store contains 5.5 percentage of alcohol and there are beers with up to a 12 percent level of alcohol.

Spend \$1.8 million in Taxpayer Funds Increase Police Patrols

Description of Program:

With a vote of 12 in favor and 0 against, the Municipal Council of Denver adopted this afternoon, the petition by Mayor Michael Hancock to add an additional 1.8 million per year to increase patrols in the center of the city, in spite the opposition on behalf of the community. Tania Soto Valenzuela from the Progressive Coalition of Colorado says, "That money can be used in a better way, be able to provide living to people who don't have one, like that live in the 16th street mall, giving them water, giving them access to public baths, therefore, we believe the money should be spent in an agenda that the community supports." It is within the plan to incorporate 10 more police officials, starting with extra shifts while new employees are hired. They will be responsible for providing greater vigilance in the Ballpark neighborhood, the lower part of downtown and along 16th street because these are the areas where there have been more crime problems lately.

POLITICS AND GOVERNMENT**

Raise the Wage

Description of Program:

Senators and community leaders today joined the national tour that will travel 20 states, titled “For a Raise” and arrived in Denver today, in order to make a call to republican congressmen Mike Coffman and Cory Gardner to support a bill that promotes the increase of the minimum wage to ten dollars with ten cents. The average salary to survive in Denver is of 19,275 dollars per year, which would cover the payment of housing, medical care, transportation, and food. If full-time workers made ten dollars an hour, his or her annual salary would be 21 thousand dollars a year. The minimum wage at national level has maintained the same since 2009 meanwhile the prices of food, gas, public services, and basic necessities continue to increase and may continue to do so if the minimum wage increases.

Juvenile Council

Description of Program:

Children and adolescents arrested for crimes committed in Colorado now have guaranteed advice from a lawyer every time they face a judge and this is thanks to the enactment of a law by the governor of the state. During the last ten years, more than forty percent of teens involved in cases of juvenile delinquency in Colorado did not count with the representation of a defense counsel at any stage in their case. With such law, the minors now have access to a lawyer from the first hearing after they are arrested, as well as having either a private attorney or legal lawyer at any hearing where a judge determines whether the accused should be released, while the case is pending.

Perspectiva Nacional

Program: Washington, DC – Show #14 2014 (WFDC)

It's been 30 years since there was a significant raise to the minimum wage. This is one of the arguments from the Obama administration and labor unions, supporting a proposal to increase the minimum wage from \$ 7.25 to \$ 10.10 an hour by 2016. This is the issue at hand in our show this week, as we speak with the Secretary of Labor, Tom Perez, whom the White House has given the task to lobby in favor to the increase. He will tell us that the current minimum wage has fallen behind in comparison to the cost of living and that even those who work full-time, they still need federal aid to make ends meet. For the labor unions, represented in this show by Kelly Fay Rodriguez, spokesman from the powerful AFL- CIO federation, the issue is one of social justice as well, since women are the most affected by these unfair wages.
