



Leased Access Policy on Indecent Programming

Under federal law, cable operators can refuse to cablecast indecent programming on leased access channels. White Cloud Communications has adopted the following policy that prohibits indecent programming on leased access channels:

1. Indecent programming will not be carried on leased access channels.
2. For purposes of this policy, “indecent programming” is defined as any programming that White Cloud Communications reasonably believes contains obscenity, indecency, or nudity, or programming that is otherwise offensive as measured by contemporary community standards. The term “programming” encompasses the entire program as submitted including any and all advertising.
3. All new leased access program providers, as well as program providers who currently have programming on leased access channels, will be subject to this policy.
4. Any program provider seeking leased access time on the system, must certify: (a) that such provider is responsible for the content of the programming, and (b) that such programmer will not submit for cablecast any programming that is indecent as defined herein. The person acknowledging this certification on behalf of the program provider must assume responsibility for the program’s content.
5. Any program provider that does not make a required certification will no longer be eligible to obtain or retain leased access channel capacity on the system.
6. White Cloud Communications reserves the right to prohibit live programming on leased access channels if it reasonably believes that the possibility of indecent programming may occur. If live programming on leased access channels is permitted, the program provider must certify that it has exercised all reasonable efforts to ensure that the programs will not contain indecent programming as defined herein. Any program provider of live programming that refuses to provide the required certifications, or violates a certification, may be prohibited from obtaining leased access channel capacity on White Cloud Communications system.
7. Any submission of indecent material by a program provider constitutes grounds for suspension of its leased access programming rights.
8. White Cloud Communications reserves the right to determine whether programming exhibited or to be exhibited is indecent. White Cloud Communications reserves the right, but shall have no obligation, to review any programming in advance to determine compliance with this policy.
9. White Cloud Communications reserves the right to revise this policy at any time for any reason including, but not limited to, compliance with applicable law.
