Hunger (Social Welfare) **U-Can Food Bank**

Fox News at 7 (7pm) & Fox News at 10 (10pm)-2/04/16-2/29/16 UCAN has scheduled food drives this month all around the county. Local coffee shops and even movie theatres will be taking collections. Emergency food boxes are put together and distributed to nearly 13,000 people a month; typically the elderly, children and those with disabilities. UCAN has a constant need of volunteers to help with the 20,000 pounds of food they work with a day.

Burns Standoff (Public Safety):

1/05/16 **Fox News at 7 (7pm) & Fox News at 10 (10pm)**—Extra law enforcement from multiple counties are helping officials in Burns with the militia takeover of an animal refuge. Concer for

safety of law enforcement and the small town as the militia occupied the Malheur National Wildlife Refuge. Megan Shinn has the story.

1/08/16 Fox News at 7 (7pm) & Fox News at 10 (10pm)-It has been almost a week since an armed group took over a wildlife refuge in Harney County. Defying the Sheriff's request for them to leave peacefully, they say they're not going anywhere. Now the Sheriff there is requesting state and federal help from all 36 counties in Oregon. Hillary Lake reports.

1/12/16 Fox News at 7 (7pm) & Fox News at 10 (10pm)-In Burns, the group of armed ranchers and anti-government activists who took over a federal wildlife refuge building, plan to meet with community members Friday to discuss a possible end to the occupation. Also today, the Fire Chief resigned his position, because he says he no longer trusts the local government there.

1/15/16 Fox News at 7 (7pm)-The Harney County Sheriff says a man is in custody in connection with stolen refuge vehicles. A community meeting scheduled for today isn't going to happen. Members of the armed group wanted to meet with the Harney County community, but we're told the meeting couldn't be held in any county buildings. They say they hope to find another place to hold one on Monday. Members of the armed group say they'll be allowing hunters onto the refuge for this weekend's annual Coyote Hunt.

1/18/16 Fox News at 7 (7pm)-Two Portland brothers have created a way for Oregonians to protest the armed group occupying a wildlife refuge in Burns, Oregon. Jake and Zach Klonsoki founded "Go Home Malheur", a website which allows people to pledge a per-day-amount tied to the length of occupation. The money will go to organizations that include Friends of the Malheur National Wildlife Refuge and Americans For Responsible Solutions. A non-profit that combats gun violence. Oregon Wild Organization is hosting rallies across the state tomorrow to support the refuge and public lands. The Eugene location will be at the old federal building at noon.

1/27/16 Fox News at 7 (7pm) & Fox News at 10 (10pm)-Packed Harney County News Conference left more questions than answers. State Police and FBI agents confronted several militants while they were on their way to a community meeting, resulting in one protestors being shot and killed. While occupiers say they still hope for a "peaceful resolution" several agencies say the remaining occupants must leave. The FBI is working to contain the Refuge. There's also several new checkpoints around the area set up by State Police.

1/28/16 Fox News at 7 (7pm) & Fox News at 10 (10pm)-Today near Burns, some checkpoints have been removed, but the Malheur Refuge remains closed. The FBI says four people remain at the refuge and they are working to get them to leave the area peacefully. Report Joe Douglas was there earlier today, and has our report.

1/29/16 Fox News at 7 (7pm)-A Federal Judge refused to release Ammon Bundy and nine others under arrest who appeared in a Portland court today. Ammon Bundy's lawyer spoke after the hearing, asking the remaining occupiers at the Wildlife Refuge to leave on Bundy's behalf. Some people in Burns say what's unfolded in their backyards the last month will have lasting effects. Cory Marshall reports.

2/01/16 Fox News at 7 (7pm) & Fox News at 10 (10pm)-Protestors descend on Burns, Oregon today. Some telling the occupiers at a wildlife refuge to leave, the other demanding the FBI to get out.

2/10/16 Fox News at 7 (7pm) & Fox News at 10 (10pm)-Developing news in Burns. The FBI says they have moved in to contain the remaining occupiers at the Malheur Wildlife Refuge.

2/11/16 Fox News at 7 (7pm) & Fox News at 10 (10pm)-The occupation of the Malheur National Wildlife Refuge is over, nearly six weeks after it began. Kristin Goodwillie reports.

The building will be redesigned, with a memorial garden where the shootings happened. The new building will be more secure, with just two main doors.

1/12/16 **Fox News at 10 (10pm)**-Roseburg Mayor, Larry Rich, delivered his State-Of-The-City Address last night. The October 1st shooting at Umpqua Community College was a big part of his Address. Rich said in a time of tragedy, the community came together with skill, bravery and professionalism.

1/18/16 **Fox News at 7 (7pm) & Fox News at 10 (10pm)**-Over the weekend, hundreds of people sang "we won't be shaken" at a UCC Strong Benefit Concert. All proceeds from the We Will Prevail Concert will benefit the families of the victims of the UCC tragedy.

1/29/16 **Fox News at 7 (7pm) & Fox News at 10 (10pm)**-Anyone who was financially affected by the tragedy at UCC on October 1st, is eligible for grant money. The UCC Strong Committee has approved the third phase of funding for those who suffered a financial loss. A transition specialist will work with current clients who have not completed their care by the end of February to match them with a local provider. People seeking counseling services for the first time can call the Center for a direct referral.
