Vaccination and Student Health (Public Health)

Fox News at 7 (7pm) & **Fox News at 10** (10pm)-News segments about new outbreaks and the debate over vaccinations and exemptions for our community's youth.

1/20/15 **Fox News at 10** (10pm)-We are learning more about the first confirmed case of measles since 2007, in Lane County. Lane County Health Officials give tips on how to protect yourself from the virus. If you think you may have measles, they say stay at home and call your doctor from there. The stress-don't go to the Doctor's office or clinic, because you may be putting others at risk.

1/20/15 **Fox News at 10** (10pm)-Pharmacies are running out of Tamiflu, particularly for infants. The flu can be fatal, especially in the elderly and infants. Locations that still have Tamiflu in stock are given.

1/21/15 **Fox News at 7** (7pm) & **Fox News at 10** (10pm)-More information on the public health concern involving measles in Lane County. A list of local stores the man who was infected with measles visited before being diagnosed and the dates he visited those locations are given. If you have been to any of the stores mentioned from December 30th-January 7th, you need to contact Lane County Public Health. Symptoms take 10-12 days to appear.

1/21/15 **Fox News at 7** (7pm) & **Fox News at 10** (10pm)-There are now several dozen cases of measles in five states, including Oregon. State law requires school students be immunized, but some parents are getting exemptions because they don't want their children vaccinated. Symptoms of measles are given, and anyone born between 1957-1971 are urged to get their vaccination records checked. The vaccines created in the 60s were found to not be effective against the disease. Parents who have filed for exemptions for their children are urged to get their children at least two rounds of the measles vaccination, especially with the new outbreak showing up here in Lane County.

1/21/15 **Fox News at 7** (7pm) & **Fox News at 10** (10pm)—Several cases of Hand Foot and Mouth Disease have been reported in Coos County. A list of symptoms from the disease are given. Health Officials urge parents of younger children to make sure their children stay hydrated should the be sick from the disease.

1/22/15 **Fox News at 7**(7pm) –Health officials say a University of Oregon student is recovering after being treated for Meningococcemia. The disease can lead to Meningitis, but had not

reached that stage in the U of O Student. It can be deadly and is highly contagious. Right now, no new cases have been reported.

1/23/15 **Fox News at 7** (7pm) & **Fox News at 10** (10pm)—An update on the Lane County man who contracted the measles. The list of businesses he visited while sick is given again, as well as the dates he visited those locations. A County Public Health Spokesperson says if you were in those businesses during the times listed, you should contact your health provider if you're having any flu-like symptoms. He says if were there outside of those times, you have a low chance of contracting the virus. Lane County Public Health recommends you still get vaccinated for the virus, if you haven't done so.

2/03/15 **Fox News at 7** (7pm) & **Fox News at 10** (10pm)-There's a second case of Miningococcemia at the University of Oregon; a serious and possibly deadly bacterial illness that can lead to Meningitis. Symptoms and how it is spread are reported on. The illness is preventable with medications, so if you think you're showing symptoms, health officials say call a healthcare professional immediately.

2/04/15 **Fox News at 7** (7pm) & **Fox News at 10** (10pm)-New information on the bacterial infection Meningococeemia at the University of Oregon. U of O officials have now sent out text messages to 1200 students that may have come into contact with the sick students. The University asks any other students who are concerned or wanted to be tested, to go straight to the Student Health Center. Details on how the infection spreads and what the symptoms are. 2/05/15 **Fox News at 7** (7pm) & **Fox News at 10** (10pm)-Today we spoke with parents involved with the National Meningitis Association, who lost their son to the disease, Meningococcal. Three U of O students have thus far come down with the disease. This segment talks about the symptoms, different strains we are and are not vaccinated against and the dangers of not being treated immediately. These parents encourage students and parents to get vaccinated right away.

2/06/15 **Fox News at 7** (7pm-We continue to follow the meningococcemia outbreak at the University of Oregon. A mother, whose son got very sick with the disease, is interviewed. She urges students to get checked should they have symptoms, even if they just think it's the flu. 2/09/15 **Fox News at 7** (7pm) & **Fox News at 10** (10pm)-Another confirmed case of meningococcemia at the University of Oregon, bringing the total to three students with the potentially fatal infection. University officials say they've contacted students and staff who may have had exposure to the student. They say those people at risk are on antibiotics as a precaution. Officials are asking people to stay vigilant and to seek medical attention right away, if you think you may have been infected.

2/17/15 **Fox News at 7** (7pm) & **Fox News at 10** (10pm)-A reminder to parents of school age kids, tomorrow is Exclusion Day in Oregon. Your kids need to be up-to-date on their immunizations or they'll have to stay home from school. Some parents do choose to "opt out", whether it be for medical, religious or philosophical reasons. Regardless, parents still must provide paperwork that they're educated on the subject of vaccines. Oregon is one of the most lenient states in the country when it comes to vaccine exemptions. But that could all change with a new Senate Bill; the proposal seeks to eliminate non-medical exemptions all together. The Bill will get its first Public Hearing tomorrow afternoon. 2/18/15 **Fox News at 7** (7pm)-Reminder to parents that today is Exclusion Day.

2/18/15 **Fox News at 7** (7pm) & **Fox News at 10** (10pm)-A U of O student died unexpectedly on Tuesday; officials are waiting for her lab results to see if she died from the bacterial infection, Meningococcemia. That is just one possibility though, and it has not been confirmed. Students at the University should be aware, but not overly concerned about the disease spreading. We're told it takes extended close contact over days to contract.

- 2/18/15 **Fox News at 7** (7pm) –Oregon lawmakers are debating a Bill that would ban non-medical exemptions for vaccines.
- 2/19/15 **Fox News at 7** (7pm) & **Fox News at 10** (10pm)-While health officials wait for the lab results on a student that died at the U of O, their main message to students is to protect yourselves. The CDC endorsed the U of O offering vaccinations, and they plan on holding a clinic very soon. The school also started a campaign warning students about the dangers of close contact and sharing. So far, health officials have handed out antibiotics to 213 students this week.
- 2/23/15 **Fox News at 7** (7pm) & **Fox News at 10** (10pm)-After lab results determined a U of O student died of the bacterial infection, Meningococcemia, the University has set up a Clinic inside the Matthew Knight Arena. University officials say it'll be a student's decision whether or not to get vaccinated; the shots could cost up to \$170. The University is asking the State to declare it as a Health Emergency to cover the cost.
- 3/03/15 **Fox News at 10** (10pm)-The mass vaccination of University of Oregon students against a deadly bacterial infection is off to a slow start. As of Monday, the school has reached less than 20% of their 22,000 student target for vaccinations. You can get the vaccination at the Student Health Center.
- 3/06/15 **Fox News at 7** (7pm)-At the U of O, 5000 students have received their Meningococcemia vaccination. The University still needs to give shot to more than 10,000 students to meet their goal of vaccinating their undergrad population. The vaccination is only for students under 25 years of age. They will hold their second mass vaccination clinic in May, but students can still get the first vaccination before that time.
- 3/11/15 **Fox News at 7** (7pm) & **Fox News at 10** (10pm)-The push to limit vaccine exemptions in Oregon has failed. Right now, the state has the highest exemption rate for kindergartners in the nation. The Bill would have eliminated religious and philosophical exemptions, meaning only medical exemptions would have been allowed.
- 3/12/15 **Fox News at 10** (10pm)- a 5th U of O student has been diagnosed with the deadly bacterial infection, Meningococcemia. The student lived off campus but was a member of a fraternity. The university has since notified people that shared classes with the student. Students can still receive the first vaccination against Meningitis from the University Health Center, and partner pharmacies in the community.
- 3/16/15 **Fox News at 10** (10pm)-Last week, a 5th student at the U of O was diagnosed with Meningococcemia. Kelly Anderson gives the latest details, along with vaccination information. If your insurance doesn't cover the vaccination, the cost will be taken care of.
- 3/16/15 Fox News at 7 (7pm) & Fox News at 10 (10pm)-County Health Officials are on alert after four students tested positive for pertussis or whooping cough in the last week. All of the 4^{th} grade students who tested positive for the infection go to Village Charter School in Eugene. Notices went out to parents on Friday.
- 3/18/15 **Fox News at 7** (7pm) & **Fox News at 10** (10pm)-U of O officials are investigation a possible 6th case of the potentially deadly bacterial infection, Meningococcemia. The University began mass vaccination efforts earlier this month; so far more than 8000 students have received the first of two or three vaccines.
- 3/19/15 Fox News at 7 (7pm) & Fox News at 10 (10pm)-The Oregon Health Authority confirmed early this morning that a 6^{th} U of O student has been infected with the deadly bacterial infection, Meningoccemia. Chris Liedle finds out more about how much longer this may be a risk.

"SLEEP Protests & Homelessness" (Public Welfare)

Fox News at 7 (7pm) & **Fox News at 10** (10pm) -News segments about the lack of places to camp for the homeless in Eugene, and the Eugene's SLEEP (Safe Legally Entitled Emergency Places to Sleep) protests in downtown Eugene.

1/28/15 **Fox News at 7** (7pm) & **Fox News at 10** (10pm)-The Homeless Count has been released: 1700 people are living without a home in Lane County. The count surveys homeless people in shelters every year at the end of January.

2/02/15 **Fox News at 7** (7pm) & **Fox News at 10** (10pm)-In Eugene, you might have noticed more homeless camps around town. City officials say these camps are not sanctioned by the City and need to be shut down. The question is when this will happen. If the Fall of 2013, the City designated several "Rest Stops" for people to live in. But with a cap of 15 to 20 people, the camps don't come close to putting a dent in a population more than a thousand homeless. The City says they're hoping to create more of these approved "Rest Stops" in the future. Finding where to put them and people who would be willing to manage them, will take some time.
