7/02/15 **Fox News at 7** (7pm) & **Fox News at 10** (10pm)-Fireworks Ban in effect this 4<sup>th</sup> of July. Locations the ban will effect are given. Fireworks Safety tips are given.

7/03/15 **Fox News at 7** (7pm) & **Fox News at 10** (10pm)-Officials have warnings for anyone celebrating the Fourth of July. Increased security at July 4<sup>th</sup> events at communities big and small respond to an FBI Bulletin warning of potential "lone wolf attacks". So if you plan to be in a big crowd or celebrating with a small group, officials say to be careful.

7/03/15 **Fox News at 7** (7pm) & **Fox News at 10** (10pm)—Updates on the Bunker Hill Complex Fire 15 miles North of Diamond Lake in Southern Oregon. Campground closures given. Update on the Central Oregon Corner Creek Fire. That one is 0% contained.

Progress on wildfires near Roseburg and Canyonville are given. Officials say residents in parts of Canyonville should be ready to evacuate. Red Cross has set up a shelter at the South County YMCA in Canyonville off Tiller Hwy. Kelly Anderson has more on evacuation orders. 7/31/15 **Fox News at 7** (7pm) & **Fox News at 10** (10pm)-Update on the "Cable Crossing Fire"

East of Glide. No homes are threatened right now, but because the fire is moving South, a Level

One Soft Evacuation is in place. This means people should pack up and be ready to evacuate if need be.

8/13/15 **Fox News at 7** (7pm) & **Fox News at 10** (10pm)-The Chambers Mill Fire near Lorane in Lane County is 40% contained. The Oregon Department of Forestry says the fire was human caused. Officials are still putting evidence together to determine the exact cause. They're asking residents to call the Department of Forestry if you know or saw anything regarding the fire. Both lanes of Territorial Highway are now back open. Some traffic delays will be in place until Friday.

8/14/15 **Fox News at 7** (7pm)-All the wildfires are forcing highways to be shut down in Southern Oregon. A list of closures is given.

8/17/15 & 8/18/15 **Fox News at 10** (10pm) & **Fox News at 7** (7pm) 8/18/15 -The John Day Fire has already destroyed 26 homes and is threatening 500 more. A number of communities in the

area are under Evacuation Notice. If you'd like to help families affected by the fire, contact the American Red Cross.

8/18/15 **Fox News at 7** (7pm) & **Fox News at 10** (10pm)-Several fire officials have sent out an Emergency Order aiming to prevent future, human caused fires. List of restrictions, which will be in place for the next few weeks.

8/19/15 **Fox News at 7** (7pm) & **Fox News at 10** (10pm)—If you operate a drone, the Federal Aviation Administration says stay away from all wildfires. The FAA issued the ban late last week. Drones can endanger firefighters flying aircraft in or near wildfires. If you're operating a drone somewhere else, you cannot fly over 400 feet high or within five miles of an airport.

8/24/15 **Fox News at 7** (7pm) & **Fox News at 10** (10pm)—The number of wildfires this year has increased. Officials say the Stouts Creek and Cable Crossing Fires were both human-caused. The Douglas Forest Protective Association says it's committed to reducing the number of human-caused fires in the county.

In the meantime, the pro-life group "40 Day For Life" say they're standing outside of the local Planned Parenthood facility for 40 days. They say they're praying for the patients and aborted fetuses and for the building to shut down. They started their vigil at the Glenwood Planned Parenthood on September 23<sup>rd</sup>.
