MAY

- A. **“35-Year-Old Murder Arrest”** 05/01/23 5pm 3:17
FOX 17 reports live from Three Rivers where local, state and federal officials announced that, thanks to DNA evidence collected at the time, a man now living in South Carolina has been arrested for the 1988 sexual assault and gruesome stabbing, beating and strangulation death of a 19-year-old mother in the presence of her infant daughter.
- B. **“Loaded Gun & Reaction”** 05/10/23 10pm 5:22
FOX 17 devotes two crews to covering an event that dominates the afternoon and evening in Grand Rapids – first an 8-year-old third grader is discovered with a loaded semiautomatic pistol in an elementary school, then the police and school district conduct a joint press conference immediately prohibiting students from using backpacks, and then FOX 17 interviews parents about their negative reaction to the backpack ban.
- C. **“Band Embezzlement”** 05/11/23 10pm 2:02
FOX 17 has a crew at Wyoming High School after police announced earlier in the day that they had arrested the president of the Wyoming High School Band Boosters for embezzling more than \$35,000, followed by the school district announcing that the booster club was being dissolved and that school officials would begin handling fundraising and all the money collected themselves.

JUNE

- A. **“Police Seek Public’s Help”** 06/01/23 6pm 2:33
FOX 17 has a crew at an apartment complex in downtown Grand Rapids after a 22-year-old mother is found shot to death in a car there alongside her 1-year-old daughter, who was not injured. Police tell FOX 17 they are conducting a manhunt for the woman’s boyfriend, who “should be considered armed and dangerous,” and also ask for the public’s help identifying two witnesses.
- B. **“New Battle Creek Chief”** 06/05/23 5pm 2:39
FOX 17 has a crew live in Battle Creek, where Shannon Bagley is named the new police chief and outlines his goals for the office – formerly the interim chief since the previous chief’s retirement six months earlier, a member of the force for two years and prior to that a 25-year veteran of the Kalamazoo Department of Public Safety.
- C. **“Gymnastics Assault Victims”** 06/21/23 10:30am 11:48
FOX 17 broadcasts live a press conference from the Kent County Prosecutor’s Office in Grand Rapids updating viewers on a former gymnastics coach’s arrest in Florida for what are now 14 preteen victims of criminal sexual assault during three separate incidents at gymnastics academies in West Michigan and asking for the public’s help identifying other potential victims.

2. COMMUNITY EVENTS:

APRIL

- A. **“Tigers Home Opener”** 04/06/23 11am 3:49
 FOX 17 has a crew live at Comerica Park in downtown Detroit where people are lined up all day to be part of a standing-room-only packed house of 44,650 on hand for the first home game of the Detroit Tigers’ 2023 baseball season against the Boston Red Sox, a contest that the Red Sox rallied to win 6-3.
- B. **“Big Dog-Owner Contest”** 04/11/23 7pm 4:24
 A FOX 17 crew goes to Belmont to speak with officials from the Cannonsburg Ski Area, which is introducing its first-ever Cannonsburg Canicross, a popular European running event where dogs and their owners compete together via a harness connected to each other by a flexible leash and that is expected to attract about a hundred teams to West Michigan.
- C. **“SpringFest For Disabled”** 04/12/23 8am 3:33
 FOX 17 presents a live interview with officials from the Grand Rapids American Business Clubs (AMBUCS) about their upcoming 35th annual SpringFest, a community-wide celebration featuring live mascots, music, entertainment and refreshments for special people of all ages with disabilities, their caretakers, relatives, friends and supporters.

MAY

- A. **“95th Tulip Time”** 05/05/23 8am 60:00
 FOX 17 has two crews, both anchors and a meteorologist in Holland for the opening morning of the 95th annual Tulip Time festival, which attracts 600,000+ visitors annually and features more than 4.5 million tulips along with parades, concerts, shows and many Dutch-related events, and which Reader’s Digest has named the “Best Small-Town Festival in America.”
- B. **“Community-Wide Flags”** 05/07/23 10pm 2:28
 FOX 17 has a crew in Lake Odessa at the Lakeside Cemetery where the American Legion and the Legion Auxiliary are conducting a community-wide get-together for entire families from all around West Michigan to place flags on hundreds of military veterans’ graves to beautify the area in advance of the annual Memorial Day holiday weekend.
- C. **“46th River Bank Run”** 05/13/23 8am 4:24
 FOX 17 has crews presenting live reports and then airing a comprehensive package on the 46th annual Amway River Bank Run around downtown Grand Rapids, a 25-kilometer competition that serves as a qualifying race for both the Boston Marathon and the Olympics on a day that hosts more than 10,000 runners in a variety of races.

JUNE

- A. **“43rd Arts Festival”** 06/02/23 8am 4:35
 FOX 17 has a crew reporting live from downtown Grand Rapids on the opening morning of the 43rd Festival of the Arts, which is billed as “West Michigan’s Kickoff to the Summer” and attracts thousands of people to a 12-square-block

area that features nonstop art exhibits, food, musical performers, dance performances and many other outdoor activities during a three-day period.

- B. **“Wear Orange Weekend”** 06/04/23 10pm 3:10
FOX 17 is in Holland where hundreds of people dressed in orange pack Centennial Park for a local rally that is part of Wear Orange Weekend, a nationwide event honoring victims and survivors of gun violence that is advocating for community safety and a better future.
- C. **“Grand Rapids Pride”** 06/17/23 10pm 3:09
FOX 17 has a crew at Calder Plaza in downtown Grand Rapids to interview organizers and attendees at the 35th annual GR Pride Festival, which serves as one of the largest one-day events each year in Grand Rapids and attracts thousands of LGBTQ+ community members, businesses, allies and organizations to celebrate diversity, inclusion and the metro area’s large LGBTQ+ community.

3. EDUCATION & YOUTH ISSUES:

APRIL

- A. **“Blake Forever Home”** 04/03/23 8am 2:57
FOX 17 presents the latest installment of its popular “Forever Home” series, seeking an adoptive family for Blake, a high-spirited 10-year-old boy from the Grand Rapids metropolitan area who has dreams of one day being a pizza chef, is currently in the foster care system and who is looking for a family to take him in permanently and love him.
- B. **“Student Spotlight”** 04/03/23 10pm 3:57
FOX 17 presents the first installment of its new “Student Spotlight” series, featuring Earnest, a teenager from Wyoming who grew up with heart problems that led to cognitive impairments and special education classes, who has excelled and received both the Teen of the Month and the Youth of the Year awards from the Boys & Girls Club in Grand Rapids.
- C. **“Student Teacher Compensation”** 04/06/23 8am 2:48
FOX 17 compiles a package chronicling why, after Gov. Gretchen Whitmer last year announced the Michigan Future Educator Stipend where the state would be providing every student teacher with \$9,600 in compensation, the payments still have not been made eight months later.

FOX 17 speaks with West Michigan educational experts about a National Center for Education Statistics report card released earlier in the day that showed that students’ American history and civics scores are on the decline nationally for the first time ever.

- B. **“New Preschool & Daycare”** 05/05/23 4pm 2:27
 FOX 17 has a crew in Zeeland where dozens of educational, community, economic development and government officials are on hand for the groundbreaking of an innovative new 43,000-square-foot, \$7.5 million Outdoor Discovery Center Network preschool and daycare center with a capacity of 250 students as part of the Gentex automotive, aircraft and fire-protection plant campus.
- C. **“Take Back Our Schools”** 05/05/23 6pm 3:13
 FOX 17 has a crew that starts out at the Willard Library in Battle Creek, where education supporters are making posters, and then follows them as they march to the First Congregational Church, where they take part in a two-hour “Take Back Our Schools” rally to provide safe school environments for educating all students, plus a one-on-one interview with the family of a high school senior who was shot to death recently.

JUNE

- A. **“Bike Helmets & Safety”** 06/03/23 10pm 2:25
 FOX 17 has a crew at Garfield Park in Grand Rapids where more than 600 children plus their parents are on hand for the Lids for Kids free bike helmets and bike safety event, which FOX 17 personalities host and which the station is also the major sponsor of.
- B. **“Stand Up for Youth”** 06/05/23 8am 3:12
 FOX 17 hosts representatives from the Boys & Girls Club of Muskegon Lakeshore and Big Brothers Big Sisters of the Lakeshore in the studio for a live interview on Saturday’s Stand Up for Youth paddleboard race fundraiser at Mona Lake in Norton Shores.
- C. **“Helping Out Youth”** 06/05/23 7pm 5:08
 FOX 17 conducts an in-depth interview with Clarkston Morgan, a Kentwood city commissioner and youth advocate who helps young people create their own narrative and details what younger generations should focus on moving into summer as well as both the misconceptions and explanations about their work ethic.

- A. **“Land Buy & New Station”** 04/01/23 10pm 2:18
 FOX 17 speaks with city and Grand Rapids Fire Department officials after the city agrees to purchase two properties on Kalamazoo Avenue SE for \$500,000 so that it can build a new \$25 million fire station and add a new engine company for an area of the Third Ward that currently is not receiving an acceptable level of fire protection, the first new fire station that the city has built in more than 40 years.

- B. **“\$300 Million Arena”** 04/06/23 10pm 6:04
 FOX 17 devotes two crews and reports live from Kalamazoo, where county commissioners just approved moving forward with the Catalyst Development Co.’s \$300 million project to construct a 320,000-square-foot multi-purpose event arena that would play host to community and sporting events in the downtown area and would provide \$54 million to the local economy.
- C. **“Affordable Housing”** 04/11/23 5pm 2:23
 FOX 17 goes to Kalamazoo County where officials announce that they are addressing the local affordable housing crisis by committing more than \$2.2 million to multi-family housing projects and supportive services so that area residents can afford the high price of homes there.

- A. **“\$250 Million Campus”** 05/01/23 5pm 2:51
 FOX 17 reports live from the groundbreaking ceremony in Muskegon for the Adelaide Pointe condominium and recreational hub campus where federal, state and local government officials are on hand as part of the \$250 million Lake Michigan waterfront revitalization project.
- B. **“\$81 Million Downtown”** 05/02/23 5pm 2:36
 A FOX 17 crew reports live from 28th Street in Wyoming where plans are announced for construction to begin soon on a new \$81 million 28th Street Revitalization Project that will create a city center downtown area of its own for Wyoming including a new multimillion-dollar pedestrian bridge, new housing, new businesses, other new commercial development, relocating all power lines underground and 3.1 miles of new trails.
- C. **“GR Businesses Flourishing”** 05/08/23 5pm 3:24
 A FOX 17 crew reports from downtown Grand Rapids about the city’s strong business culture, which has resulted in more than 50 new businesses opening their doors and speaks with business owners plus GR’s busy coordinator of business attraction and retention about new incentives.

JUNE

- A. **“Business Start-Ups”** 06/07/23 7pm 4:41
 FOX 17 sits down for an in-depth interview with the director of business growth for Spring GR and a woman who successfully started her own event-venue business with assistance from the organization, a business accelerator nonprofit agency that helps participants get their business ideas off the ground and then with keeping their businesses running prosperously for years to come.
- B. **“\$490 Million Economic Impact”** 06/12/23 10pm 3:16
 FOX 17 reports live from the scene of a packed community meeting where developers answer questions, address concerns, and unveil major changes regarding building a new outdoor amphitheater in downtown Grand Rapids, a \$116 million, 85,000-square-foot, 10.6-acre venue that’s the key component of

- C. **“Government Clean-Up”** 05/16/23 10pm 3:05
FOX 17 has a crew at the former Spartan Chemical storage property in Wyoming, which is contaminated by widespread volatile organic compounds left behind, as Michigan Department of Environment, Great Lakes and Energy officials are on the scene preparing the site for a massive six-month cleanup, remediating the extensive soil, sediment, surface water, groundwater and air contamination.

JUNE

- A. **“New Abortion Bill”** 06/01/23 5pm 2:34
FOX 17 has a crew at the State Capitol in Lansing interviewing a Coopersville Michigan House of Representatives member about a new bill that would reinstate a 1931 ban on abortions in Michigan, remove Proposition 3 from the Michigan Constitution and reinstate bans on both the sale of prescription abortion pills and advertising for abortion services.
- B. **“House Committee Hearing”** 06/05/23 10pm 3:31
FOX 17 has a crew at the State Capitol in Lansing covering Michigan House of Representatives Criminal Justice Committee testimony on the Access To Justice bills package that would provide sexual abuse survivors with more time to take action against sexual predators and pedophiles.
- C. **“Hair Discrimination Law”** 06/15/23 6pm 2:35
FOX 17 has a crew at a popular African-American hair salon in Grand Rapids speaking with the owner on the same day that Gov. Gretchen Whitmer signs a bill into law banning hair discrimination, known as the CROWN Act for “Creating a Respectful and Open World for Natural Hair,” updating Michigan’s Elliott-Larsen Civil Rights Act of 1976.

6. HEALTH:

APRIL

- A. **“Carbon Monoxide Awareness”** 04/02/23 10pm 4:34
FOX 17 speaks with the National Carbon Monoxide Awareness Association, a nonprofit based here in Michigan, the Plainfield Township Fire Department chief and the DTE Energy director of gas operations on increasing awareness about carbon monoxide poisoning and the importance of all businesses and residences having working carbon monoxide detectors.
- B. **“Spring Allergy Season”** 04/03/23 8am 2:04
FOX 17 interviews a local allergy doctor about the spring allergy season that is currently getting underway, which is expected to last longer and affect more people than in years past due to climate trends, a report that is directed toward the 25 percent of all Americans who suffer from seasonal allergies.
- C. **“Lead In Kalamazoo Homes”** 04/05/23 5pm 3:06
A FOX 17 crew is in Kalamazoo speaking with city officials after the Kalamazoo City Commission this week approved a grant worth more than \$3

million from the U.S. Department of Housing & Urban Development to reduce the hazards of lead-based paint in older homes, a problem that is particularly widespread in Kalamazoo.

On the first day of Mental Health Awareness Month, FOX 17 interviews the founders of two groups partnering together to operate a Hudsonville nonprofit that addresses mental health issues through running – conducted while the reporter and both interviewees are at a gym walking on treadmills.

FOX 17 speaks with West Michigan estheticians about controversial changes that the Michigan Board of Cosmetology is implementing for skin care specialists and the beauty industry statewide, specifically that they will no longer be able to perform many of the procedures that they have received specialized training in.
