As a community in Cowlitz County, Family Promise seeks to provide the means necessary to help in times of crisis. For Family Promise, community is where families are valued for their talents and what they bring to the community. They are day by day building a place where people don't just survive – they thrive. At this shelter that houses four families at a time and is highly supported by 9-10 partner churches, they try to prevent homelessness with rental assistance, education and resources, and mediation. On-going support includes stabilization and case management for up to a year later. Churches help with Christmas adopt-a-family furniture, moving, tutoring and mentorship.</p>

They believe that everyone can bring something to the table to help. Since 2016, thousands of people, including individuals, families, businesses, schools, civic groups, and faith communities have shown up in radically generous, creative, and loving ways. They are actively raising up new foster (resource) homes. There is a consistent need in Lane County for safer, caring homes for children. Last year, 700 children spent time in foster care in Lane County, with 70% spending time in more than one foster home. Many were split from their siblings. This group is looking to find foster homes that are good fits for each child. People start first in expressing interest to Every Child, who then can get them into a certification program. Caring for kids can happen in a variety of ways, including meeting tangible needs, participating in their My Neighbor Program, and supporting their Brighter Side Giving Store. What really changes things is not a physical home, as much a relationship.</p>

Notably, Generation Z Christians are “missionaries” to their own generation, with 82% of such teenagers reporting having shared about God in the last year. 		<p>Post-traumatic stress can occur following a life-threatening event like military combat, natural disasters, terrorist incidents, serious accidents, or violent personal assaults. People who suffer from PTSD often suffer from nightmares, flashbacks, difficulty sleeping, and feeling emotionally numb. Members of the military exposed to war/combat and other groups at high risk for trauma exposure are at risk for developing PTSD. Among veterans returning from the current wars in Iraq/Afghanistan, PTSD and mild to moderate traumatic brain injury (TBI) are often linked and their symptoms may overlap. The physical changes that take place in the body and brain following trauma are beginning to be understood, but most treatments for these changes are still experimental. This makes it difficult to “hold on” until hope can be found for many veterans. The Mighty Oaks Foundation is committed to serving the brokenhearted by providing intensive peer-based discipleship through a series of programs, outpost meetings, and speaking events, hosting Mighty Oaks Warrior Programs for men and women, as well as Marriage Advance Programs. The Warriors who attend are fully sponsored for training, meals, and lodging needs to ensure that upon arrival to the ranch, each Warrior is focused solely on recovery and identifying purpose going forward.</p>

		<p>Economy was defined as productive families that are unified and complementary, practically providing for the needs of the family and producing things as distinguished from the individual or corporate economy where the family is fragmented and each goes to his own place through the day. Children are part of serving and helping in age-appropriate ways. The husband and wife work together in a family economy per Genesis 2. While the Industrial Revolution had many positives, it moved fathers from the home during the most productive hours of the day and machinery took the place of the family helping each other. Deuteronomy 6 is a very good picture of the blessings of being in a covenant community, family, or church. For example, Pastor Simmons has built a family economy through a construction business; while he makes bids for jobs, his sons perform the construction and his daughter is responsible for accounting. Pastor Simmons advised to start your own family economy to be self-sufficient, including family devotions in the evenings for family discipleship. Grandparents can teach their grandchildren and multigenerational family unit is biblical and early puritans were interdependent and formed a microeconomy. He shared how one family has opened a store with the mother and kids homeschooling in the back while the father maintains the store. There are practical steps that parents and even grandparents can take now to build a successful and God honoring “family economy” model of the pilgrims and puritans – including bee keeping, raising chickens, and growing your garden.</p>
