Ms. Brown and Mr. Aitken told the viewers about this year's MLK Day of Service, and their combined efforts to help the homeless in Montgomery. They are collecting warm clothing, monetary donations, and toiletries for the homeless that are served through Mid Alabama Coalition for the Homeless. The collection will take place on January 20th from 9 A.M. – Noon at the Fortitude Building at 410 S. Decatur Street. On any given night, over 800 people are homeless in our area according to the Mid-Alabama Coalition for the Homeless. For the State, there was an estimated 3,4234; of that total, 280 were family households, 339 were Veterans, 158 were young adults (18-24), and 540 were those experiencing chronic homelessness. Ms. Brown said Delta Sigma Theta is committed to helping the needs of the homeless, and they know affordable housing, mental health, employment skills, education, and health care are all factors that contribute to homelessness.

Tours are given Monday – Saturday, and this keeps Ms. Battle very busy. She is very informative, and has a wealth of knowledge about Dexter, and her City. She is also entertaining, she will break out in song, or prayer, if she feels that someone needs it. She told Mandy about Steven Spielberg visiting the church after hours one night. People from the Equal Justice Initiative will often call them and tell them someone will like to visit after hours, but don't tell them who it is. On this night, a group came in with a man who had a cap pulled down below his brow. She walked up to them, and grab their hands and formed a circle. When they introduced themselves, Mr. Spielberg said, "Hi, I'm Steven." She said by the prompting of the Holy Spirit, she asked, "As in Steven?" and he told her yes. She said she was led to pray for him, and he was very receptive, and thankful. Afterwards, they all sang spirituals, and praise songs. She said that people come from all over the world every day, and after touring EJI and the Memorial, Dexter is their next stop. She said that a lot of those that come in, are hurting in one way or another. Ms. Battle loves people, all people, and said informing people about Dexter, and Montgomery brings her so much joy, and is a perfect fit for her.

Eli White, Human Trafficking Advocate One Place Family Justice Center

January is Human Trafficking Awareness Month, and blue is the color of the ribbon or the heart that represents Human Trafficking Awareness Month that is observed this month. Ms. Baker and Mr. White discussed Human Trafficking, and told the viewers what it is. It is slavery. They told how many kinds of trafficking there are: Involuntary Domestic Servitude; Child Soldier; Sex Trafficking; Forced Labor; and Bonded Labor, and how they operate. They gave 2018 statistics for Human Trafficking in Alabama, and the top venues/industries for sex trafficking and labor trafficking. They also discussed what makes Montgomery susceptible to human trafficking, what makes victims susceptible to human trafficking, how traffickers prey on our most valuable resource – our children, they gave some signs to indicate that an individual is possibly being trafficked, and told the viewers what we should do if we see the signs of someone being trafficked. They gave out numbers to the One Place Family Justice Center, National Human Trafficking Hotline, Federal Law Enforcement, Local Law Enforcement, and a Human Trafficking Hotline for viewers to call if they know, or suspect that someone is trafficking, or being trafficked.

Today's guests talked about the Annual Voice in Black History Competition. Registration ends January 27, and the finals are February 21. Students in 3rd through 12th grades can compete, and they have to register at any MCCPL Library and print off the Library's form from their website at mccpl.lib.al.us. They told when and where the preliminary competitions will be held. Participating students have to present a monologue as a Black Historical Figure. 3rd-5th graders have 3-5 minutes to present their speech; 6th-12th graders have 47 minutes. The speech have to be memorized and presented as the person they have chosen, and in costume. The Library sponsors the competition because they hope to empower students to explore the culture and legacies of influential Black Historical Figures. Through research and speech preparation, these students will also learn valuable skills on how to present information with confidence, and can carry over to school, colleges, and jobs. They said this annual Celebration is a way for everyone to commemorate the achievements of African Americans – not only for their students, but the community as a whole, and it is an opportunity to pay homage to our past. Topic: Heart Health Nutrition

Guests: Shannon Randolph, Registered Dietitian, Capitol Hill Healthcare

February is American Heart Month, and Ms. Randolph said this is a good time to look at what we all can do to protect ourselves from heart disease. She also said about 100 million adults are living with some form of cardiovascular disease or the after-effects of stroke, and many of these people are over the age of 40. Heart disease can happen at any age, but older people are especially at risk for developing this condition. She said as our bodies age, it's common for our arteries to become stiffer, and over our lifetimes, we also build up plaque in our blood vessels that can cause them to narrow. Heart disease can be deadly; however, the good news is that it's never too late to fight it. Diet is an important factor in managing or preventing heart disease, and Ms. Randolph talked about eating a balanced diet, what a person can do to make sure their diet is healthy, make sure you're eating balanced amounts of fruits and vegetables, whole grains, low-fat or fat-free dairy products, lean meats, and legumes. She also discussed heart-healthy goods, reducing sodium, cooking in healthier ways. And what else we can do to support the health of our hearts (limiting alcohol, managing stress, physical activities such as walking 30 minutes a day, 5 times or more per week, and stopping the use of tobacco products.

He talked about the legislation that made the black vote possible in America and in Alabama. Mandy asked if Black History has lost any of its significance over the years, and what should we remember regarding Black History observance. As he does every year, Dr. Bailey said that everyone's History is important, and everyone should know about their history.

Guest: Sylvia Dunn, Rehab Manager/Heart Health Survivor, Baptist Hospital

Ms. Dunn shared her history and her experience as a Rehab Manager with the viewers. She works at Baptist Health Cardiac Rehabilitation Program that has been in operation since 1979. She said that when it comes to rehab, they take a team approach, and the patient is the most important part, because they benefit most from the team approach. She explained what is involved in cardiac rehabilitation, and said some of the benefits are strengthening and conditioning of the heart and lungs, weight control, low cholesterol levels, knowing about your medicines, recognizing signs and symptoms of heart disease, and knowing when to seek medical attention, and providing emotional support for you and your family. The patient will engage in a supervised exercise program while on a heart monitor, and will participate in education sessions and have peer support as well. She said most patients usually qualify for 12-36 visits, but time allowed is dictated by the patient's insurance company. Ms. Dunn did all of these things when she had her episode, and still practice them to this day. She said that going through this, helped her a lot when dealing with her patients.
