Below is a list of the station's most significant programming treatment of those issues for the period of OCTOBER 1-DECEMBER 31, 2021

**HEALTHCARE-** This station chose to address a variety of health issues of continuing importance to our listeners. These issues cover areas of health care ranging from infants to adults.

**THE ARTS-** This station believes it is important to support the arts and the entities that work hard to bring the arts to this community, whether it be a museum or a theater group.

### October 3<sup>rd</sup>

This week we touch base with the Oklahoma Blood Institute to discuss ongoing blood drives and the continued urgent need for convalescent plasma donations.

In segment two our focus shifts to the Regional Food Bank of Oklahoma's need for volunteers to help pack food boxes and assist in other facets of their charitable efforts in our Oklahoma communities.

### October 10<sup>th</sup>

Sunbeam Family Services stops in to the studio to highlight their Grandparents Raising Grandchildren program. They have seen an overwhelming increase in clients in this area of service but many more families need to know the services exist.

We check in with the Oklahoma City County Health Department on the current status of caseload , vaccination, and testing for Covid 19.T

### October 17<sup>th</sup>

Representatives from the Oklahoma City County Health Department checked in with a pandemic update

Sunbeam Family Services Early Childhood Development department made an appeal for teachers, offering a \$1000 incentive to new hires.

### October 24<sup>th</sup>

Mistletoe Market organizers from the Oklahoma County Junior league gave an introduction to projects they fund by doing the event.

Canadian County CASA joined us for an update on their newest programs including updated support groups.

### October 31<sup>st</sup>

The Regional Food Bank of Oklahoma, just like the rest of the country, is experiencing supply chain issues. We discuss the things they are doing to make sure Oklahomans experiencing food insecurities can feed their families during a time of increased need.

We expand our conversation with the Junior Leagues organizers of Mistletoe Market, an event November 5<sup>th</sup> - 8<sup>th</sup>. Vendor highlights and other features are discussed.

November 7<sup>th</sup>

There is a massive need for blood in Oklahoma and we visit with the Oklahoma Blood Institute to help them spread the word about their ongoing efforts in the state.

The Regional Food Bank of Oklahoma has just announced their holiday match. We welcome them back to give us details.

November 14<sup>th</sup>

Sunbeam Family Services is the largest provider of Foster Care in the metro area. Since the beginning of the pandemic, the need for foster families has increased. We discuss the fact that Sunbeam welcomes all types of families to become foster parents. This includes LGBTQ+ parents, single people over the age of 21 and other non-traditional families. They also provide virtual training for potential providers.

We include in our second segment Sunbeam's Early childhood team, once again hoping to find more teachers for their 0-3 age group. The waiting list is much longer than current staffing can accommodate.

November 21

First Americans Museum is now open in Oklahoma City and we were fortunate enough to welcome two representatives from their community to give us insight on the new facility.

Once again, we check in with the Oklahoma City County Health Department on pandemic situation. We discuss a way to safely gather for Thanksgiving.

November 28<sup>th</sup>

The founder of an organization called Teacher Appreciation Foundation gives us the background of the founding of the group. His mother was a teacher and her legacy is now honoring all school staff, not just teachers.

We extend our conversation about the collection housed in the First American's museum and its special meaning to native Oklahomans.

December 5<sup>th</sup>

Once again Sunbeam Family Services appeals to the public in their search for early childhood teachers. Their incentive has now increased to \$2000 after 90 days for eligible teachers.

The newest fundraiser for the Teacher Appreciation Foundation will actually take place on a cruise. We are given the details of the trip and how it will benefit the awards and contribute to scholarship for staff.

December 12<sup>th</sup>

As is our habit, we check in the Oklahoma City County Health Department on the ongoing updates for testing and treatment of Covid 19. We discussed state covid numbers and testing.

Blood donation and donation of convalescent plasma are vital for patients in our hospitals. The Oklahoma Blood Institute has ongoing strategies in place to provide all that is needed. We discuss the operation and what OBI does in addition to blood donations.

December 19<sup>th</sup>

The Oklahoma City Museum of Art offers a wonderful variety of collections for the public to enjoy. We welcomed two representatives on the program to give us an explanation of the current collection.

We give one last push for the Holiday Match for the Regional Food Bank of Oklahoma since it ends with 2021.

December 26

Remerge is an organization that provides help and support for women who are leaving incarceration to return to normal life. Our first segment focuses on the efforts taken by Remerge to assist these women and their children in moving forward with healthy lives.

Redesigned in collaboration with Dale Chihuly, Magic and Light is the title of The Oklahoma City Museum of Art's largest collection of the iconic artist's work. We discuss upcoming new installations including some traveling exhibits coming to the museum.
