Nov 24th

Sunbeam Family Services provided information for both of our segments this week. One featuring information about senior care, and the other about foster care.

Dec 1st

This week was a replay of both Sunbeam Family Services segments from the previous week.

Dec 8th

Allied Arts brought up a representative from the Oklahoma City Ballet to tell us about their upcoming show and about the work they are doing for our city. Upward Transitions had 3 people here to talk about their work with the homeless and keeping people from becoming homeless in the first place.
