American History	Florida Roundtable	<p>Yaffee: Yaffee updates the latest news out of Florida this week. - 10 minutes</p> <p>W/Hazelgrove: Hazelgrove gives his background as a historian and the books he's written so far on American history. He then reacts to the protests over historical figures who owned slaves and the push to tear down their monuments and erase their history. He believes it is important to look at them in the context of the time period they lived in. Also explains what inspired him to write about American history in the first place. He then talks about the important of getting flood insurance, especially before hurricane season. He believes almost everyone in Florida should have it. He also talks about how many insurance providers offer flood insurance and that private flood insurance is growing.
