It would cause the budget to go down by more than 5 million dollars. Robertson spoke with me about needing to raise the staffing ratio, leaving it up to individual school leaders to decide on how to split teachers across multiple subjects and schools. Any class that's being cut from next year is being caused by not enough students signing up. The plan does include eliminating a few assistant principal positions, technician and library jobs. This would be done by not rehiring those positions when the current staffers retire or quit. No layoffs here. If the citywide tax cut goes through, they would forego replacing school buses, along with some landscaping and maintenance expenses. Although enrollment issues are leading to tough decisions by individual school principals, Dr. Robertson says he and the rest of the school board are doing what they can to keep fine arts courses intact.

Cody's disappearance sparked grassroots groups that were demanding justice, and they were at the Hampton courthouse throughout the trial. Before Cody, there was the Noah Tomlin case in Hampton which also involved the killing of a toddler. Chief Talbot says any case with such a victim leaves an indelible mark on those who investigate it. You don't go through this career without that happening at at some point and when it does happen you never forget it those types of investigations keep pieces of you keep parts of your soul and I don't think you ever recover from it.

Projects like the toll relief package, and free trips through the Downtown and Midtown Tunnels for anyone making \$50,000 a year or less. It could provide 35 years of substantial toll relief for citizens in Portsmouth and Norfolk. 14 free trips a week, and also begin to pay for fees and unpaid balances. But the governor has an equally large task ahead of him, the \$2.6 billion in tax increases in the current budget proposal. After all the progress we've made, we're not going to go backward. "Progress", he says, "in the form of \$5 billion generated in tax relief over the last two years. Youngkin says he's sure he and the assembly can come to terms without calling a special session once they return on April 17th. We're not going to have tax increases for Virginians. We can still fund key priorities in education and law enforcement and behavioral health."
