The military is now notifying next of kin before the names are released. A Marine Corps spokesperson says the plane was a 4th Marine Aircraft Wing asset which is headquartered in New Orleans, Louisiana.

Attorney General Mark Herring called the airport's spending unconstitutional following a five-month audit by VDOT released last month. Before any money is released, Layne says all board members must go through conflict of interest and freedom of information training.
