The Governor says that this project has the potential to drive off shore wind not just for Virginia but also for the entire East Coast. The district says its learned a lot since lead was first detected late last year. We're told the district began following what's called 3T guidelines from the Environmental Protection Agency. In the long term, the district plans to work with lawmakers to develop new legislation to give other schools more guidance - something he says Virginia Beach didn't have.

The DMV says the number one issue is people not crossing at intersections. Plus there's more distractions for pedestrians and drivers such as cell phones. VDOT has released a Pedestrian Safety Action Plan. It lists multiple locations across the state where officials suggest improvements to be made. One of the spots on their high priority list is here in Hampton Roads - Pacific Avenue at the Resort Area.
