**Part II** lists the educational programs which will be regularly - scheduled for the next quarter – July 1, 2012 through September 30, 2012. This is in response to Question 14.

FOX SPORTS' "MLB Player Poll" series meets the FCC's requirements for "core" educational/informational programming and can be counted towards your station's three hour per week educational programming requirement.

**Please note: This program was preempted by FOX SPORTS on April 14th, April 28th, May 12th, and May 19th for live sport's coverage. We only note these network preemptions on the preemption report. We remind you that you must note individual station preemptions accordingly. Only rescheduled episodes continue to count as "core".** **FOX has informed the FCC that the preempted episodes would be rescheduled in a "second home" (12PM Eastern/9AM Pacific) and that the network will comply with all the appropriate on-air announcements in *MLB Player Poll* and in the relevant MLB game promos (as well as notifying the listing services of the new times) so that FOX affiliates can continue to count the rescheduled episodes of *MLB Player Poll* as "core" educational children's programming.**

Erie School District Budget Woes

In order to close its multi-million dollar budget deficit, the Erie School District looked for options from all over. In April, we reported on a couple of the options, and had many angles to the story because of the different groups of people affected. Teachers who qualified were offered an early retirement option, which helped the district close the gap. But the majority of the reporting was dedicated to the second option used: closing and consolidating schools. Parent and student reaction was plentiful, as a lot of them were disappointed and confused by the district's decision. Many teachers and parents were also concerned about the class sizes once the changes were implemented. Also affected was kindergarten registration, which was delayed because of the confusion regarding school closings.

Our coverage included candidate profiles for all involved in each local race. Newsmaker segments – live interviews during the 5:30pm newscasts – often involved political science experts from local universities giving their take on local races and the Republican presidential

primary. On April 24, viewers saw live coverage from the victory parties and results as they were reported by election officials.

### ATV Fatal Accident

Police are called to a wooded area just off of Arbuckle Road near Wattsburg, PA for an ATV crash. The initial 9-1-1 call reported that somebody was trapped under the vehicle. The driver, 8-year-old Kaleigh Katulich, lost control of the ATV. The vehicle rolled on top of her, and she was pronounced dead at the scene. The two passengers one being her 49-year-old uncle, Louis Haibach, were injured and taken to UPMC Hamot. Our coverage included details of the actual accident, as well as ATV safety and accident prevention. The incident could have led to charges of involuntary manslaughter against Haibach. However, District Attorney Jack Daneri, decided there would be no charges filed after meeting with state police as well as the victim's mother.

### Tania Coleman/ Xavier Holloman Sentencing

A discovery in May of 2011, shocked the community when the decomposing body of 14-month-old Alayja Coleman was found in a suitcase. Her mother, Tania Coleman, with the help of her boyfriend Xavier Holloman, was accused of starving the baby to death, then stuffing her body in a suitcase leaving it to decompose. The suitcase became the plan only after the plan to bury the body in a grave and cover it with cement, failed. This May, both Tania Coleman and Xavier Holloman were sentenced. Holloman, who was accused of digging the hole, purchasing the garbage can, and helping to place the body in the suitcase, pled guilty and was sentenced to 9 months to a year in jail for abuse of a corpse and tampering with evidence. The day after he was sentenced, he was set free as he had already served nearly 10 months in jail. He was given 2 years of probation. Coleman, who was found guilty of first degree murder in March, was sentenced to life behind bars. We covered the incident extensively since last May. The coverage of the sentencing included word from the District Attorney as well as Holloman's attorney. We also heard reactions from Coleman's family members after she was sentenced.

The advice initially just included any vehicle with front-end damage, cracked headlight, hood damage and possibly a cracked windshield. Later police released that they believed the vehicle to be a 2002-2009 GMC Envoy.
