Community Activism	#PassTheMicYouth	4/12/20	22 min	#PassTheMicYouth follows student Sidney Uriarte as she returned to her home country of Nicaragua to visit family. During her visit, the country became enveloped in massive student-led anti-corruption protests which Sidney took part in. We discuss Sidney's story, the role of young activists, and social media as a tool for activism.
Community Activism	#PassTheMicYouth	4/20/20	21 min	Dominique always loved art. When the Trump administration rescinded DACA, she used her talent to spread a message without even having to say a word. Hosts Sam, Nyawira, and Luke discuss the importance of clothing in activism and self-expression.
