Community Activism	#PassTheMicYouth	1/13/20	22 min	Several high school students in the Juntos program have written two books about their experiences, communities, and activism! This episode of #PassTheMicYouth features a conversation among these young literary activists as they discuss what young people bring to the table, the ways they've told the stories of their community, and what they've learned along the way.

Health and Safety/Human Sexuality	Eye on the Triangle	1/22/20	31 min	Interview with Doctor Kami Kosenko on sexual education and how individuals communicate about sexual relations. The interview concentrated on what individuals can learn about sex in regard to emotional health and discovery of identity.
Health and Safety/Human Sexuality	Eye on the Triangle	1/22/20	7 min	Long form PSA on the importance, accessibility, and use of birth control. A detailed breakdown on the mechanics of birth control, how it can be taken, and what any user should know.
