04/02/18 - Senator Doug Jones thinks EPA Administrator Scott Pruitt is in real trouble. During Pruitt's first six months in Washington, DC, he rented a single bedroom for 50-dollars-per-night in a condo co-owned by the wife of an environmental and energy lobbyist.

04/02/18 – MICHIGAN – Groundwater at Gerald R. Ford International Airport is being tested for toxic chemicals, known as PFAS or PFC's. The concerns come from a type of foam firefighters used in training sessions that were hosted at the airport decades ago.

04/17/18 - The FCC hit T-Mobile with a 40-million-dollar fine after being accused of covering up poor cell service with "false rings." The commission announced the settlement which requires the company to implement a "compliance plan" to fix the problem.

04/17/18 – FLINT - A job fair is being held in Flint today to fill more than 75 manufacturing positions. The unnamed company is a Tier 1 Defense and aerospace manufacturer. The job fair will be held at the Dort Federal Event Center in Flint from 2 – 7 p.m.

05/09/18 – MICHIGAN - The Fermi Two nuclear power plant is back online after undergoing repairs for nearly a month. The plant shutdown in April after a transformer malfunction, and an issue with a valve on the reactor recirculation system.

05/30/18 – LANSING - Crews are working to fix a sinkhole that formed on Lake Drive in Haslett Monday. The sinkhole is located on the northeast side of Lake Lansing near the boat launch.

06/13/18 - Michigan's first county veteran fund has been approved by lawmakers with less than half of its proposed \$5 million appropriation. The state House voted unanimously Tuesday to create the County Veteran Service Fund.

06/28/18 - Michigan officials are looking for accomplished motorcyclists who could teach others to ride. Secretary of State Ruth Johnson says safety class instructors play essential roles in the Michigan Rider Education Program.

## Huron, Tuscola & Sanilac County Stories:

UBLY -- The Ubyly Village Council last week discussed a "very underutilized grant," which would help make routes to school for Ubyly students safer.

Village Treasurer Kelly Pearce presented the Safe Routes to School (SRTS) grant to the council, which could provide up to \$200,000 for both the Ubyly elementary and junior high schools.

CASS CITY -- Cass City Village officials are focusing on making the community the best it can be to draw business development.

One of the strategic planning goals is to eliminate blight.

"Addressing blight is a directive of the council and strategic planning," said village Manager Debbie Powell.

BAD AXE -- Michigan State University Extension will be offering a six-week series called Diabetes Personal Action Towards Health (PATH) next month.

The courses will run from 5 to 7:30 p.m. Thursdays, starting May 3 to June 7 at the Huron County MSU Extension office in Bad Axe.

TUSCOLA COUNTY — Michigan State Police is confirming it is investigating a homicide that occurred Friday, in the 9800 block of Boucher in Watertown Twp.

Troopers responded to the residence and discovered 45-year-old Peter Carl Brodick deceased inside of the residence from apparent gunshot wounds.

CASS CITY — "Amazing," was Cass City School District's CEO Allison Zimba's response after seeing a presentation by students about a club they started. During a recent school board meeting, a group of fifth-grade girls explained how the "Choose Kindness Club" was started and some of the things that they do. The Choose Kindness Club now has about 55 volunteer members who joined together to make a difference. "It is a great thing that they did. We are very proud of them," said Superintendent Jeff Hartel.

SEBEWAING — A legal dispute between a former educator and the Unionville-Sebewaing Area School District ended with the court siding with the teacher. In May 2016, the USA Board of Education approved laying off Teacher Barbara Merchant Tilt, of Cass City, after 21 years of service. The union claimed the district violated the Michigan Public Employment Relations Act. The union also alleged the district discriminated against Tilt and treated her differently because of her union activities as union president and Grievance Chair.

TUSCOLA COUNTY — A suspect is in custody, but no formal charges have been filed in a double homicide in Tuscola County over the weekend. Police say the 36-year-old suspect, who has not been identified, has yet to be formally charged in the shooting deaths of roommates Peter Carl Brodick, 45, and Wendy Brodick, 55, of Watertown Township. Peter Brodick's body was discovered Friday in his residence in the 9800 block of Boucher Road. Wendy Brodick's body was found Sunday near a silo in neighboring Millington Township.

CARSONVILLE – Michelle Campbell, a fifth grade teacher at Carsonville Port Sanilac Elementary School, was named a 2017-2018 'LifeChanger of the Year' award winner at a surprise ceremony during a celebration in the school's gymnasium Monday afternoon. As a LifeChanger of the Year award winner, Campbell received a \$3,000 cash award to be shared with her school. The award was presented to Campbell by National Life Group representative Jay Dunlap. Campbell was selected as a LifeChanger of the Year winner out of more than 825 teachers, administrators and school district employees nominated for the award from all 50 states and the District of Columbia.
