4/15/19 NATIONAL Severe, deadly weather continues to plague the southeast part of the country. One person is dead in eastern Mississippi and eleven more hurt following a tornado that struck Saturday.

4/15/19 LANSING E-scooters and other electric mobility devices are now allowed on Michigan State University's campus. The Board of Trustees approved an ordinance that allows electric mobility devices to be used on roads and in bicycle lanes.

5/17/19 NATIONAL Missouri might be the next state to pass a restrictive abortions law. The state Senate approved a bill Thursday that would make most abortions past eight weeks of pregnancy illegal.

5/17/19 MICHIGAN Fiat Chrysler and the City of Detroit will be establishing eight hiring centers for the upcoming expansion of the Mack Avenue Plant. The centers are expected to be fully operational by the end of theyear.

5/17/19 LANSING A 35-year-old man has been charged with armed robbery of Hawaii Health Spa. Zachary Merrill Laguire from Charlotte is being held on a 500,000 bond for using a firearm and demanding money from the spa on Lansing Rd.

6/27/19 NATIONAL Senate Republicans are asking House Speaker Nancy Pelosi to put their version of a border funding bill up for a vote. The bipartisan Senate bill easily passed with 84 votes Wednesday.

6/27/19 MICHIGAN The Michigan Department of Transportation will completely close I-75 in Oakland County tonight. The closures are necessary as new bridge beams will be installed at the Wattles and Corporate Drive overpasses.
